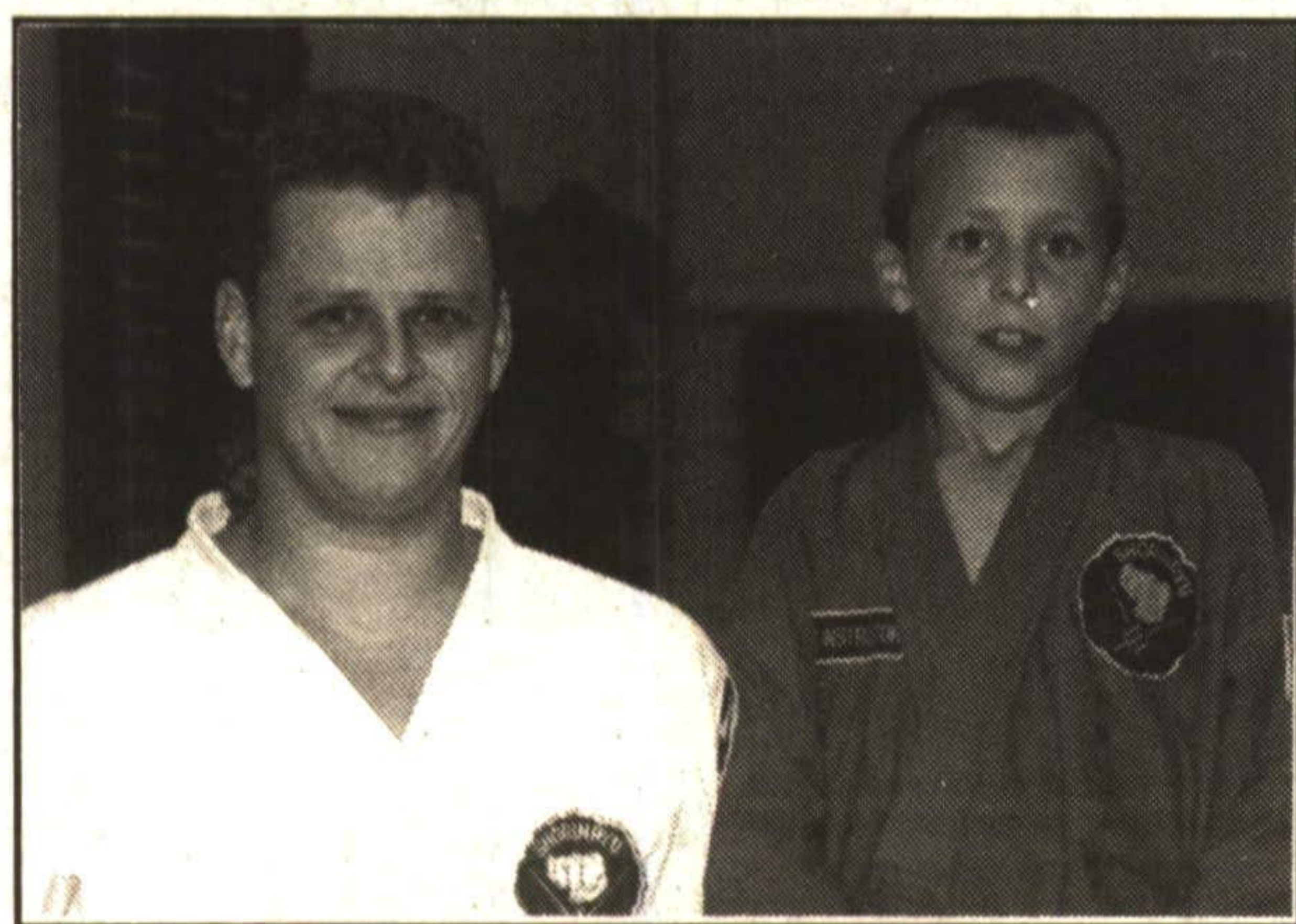

Boreland's School of Karate is a family business which just became full-time last spring.

Pam and Chris Boreland operate the school and their 10-year-old son Dustin, who has his black belt, helps teach some of the classes. Chris started karate when he was 11 years old and received his black belt when he was 16 years

old. Dustin is the youngest student ever to receive his black belt in Shorin-Ryu karate, a very traditional form of karate, taught at the school.

The school specializes in teaching children and offers classes every evening and on Saturdays. Children can start karate when they are 4 years old.

Dustin helps with the 4 to 8 year olds, but can also help the 9 to 14 year olds and adult classes, said his mother Pam, who has a green belt in karate. She doesn't teach it but helps with self defense classes.

Bracky's Tap and Grill at Moore Park Plaza is a quaint neighborhood pub which is just about to get bigger.

The pub, which owners Dave and Karen Bracken operate, boasts the best chicken wings in the country and lots of excellent pub food, not to forget six varieties of draft on tap.

It sponsors three dart teams and has an in-house dart league on Tuesday nights. A high-tech satellite dish connects Bracky's to NTN, an interactive network with a trivia game connecting 2,500 bars across North America. The bar sponsors a local hockey team and three ball teams.

It currently seats 50 people, and

will soon offer another section, doubling its capacity. Dave said he will be able to accommodate more large groups (who can make reservations) and patrons will be able to choose a noisy bar section or a quieter area.

Dave does most of the cooking while Karen lends a hand when needed.

The business has continued a 36-year tradition offering top-notch service on quality, name brand

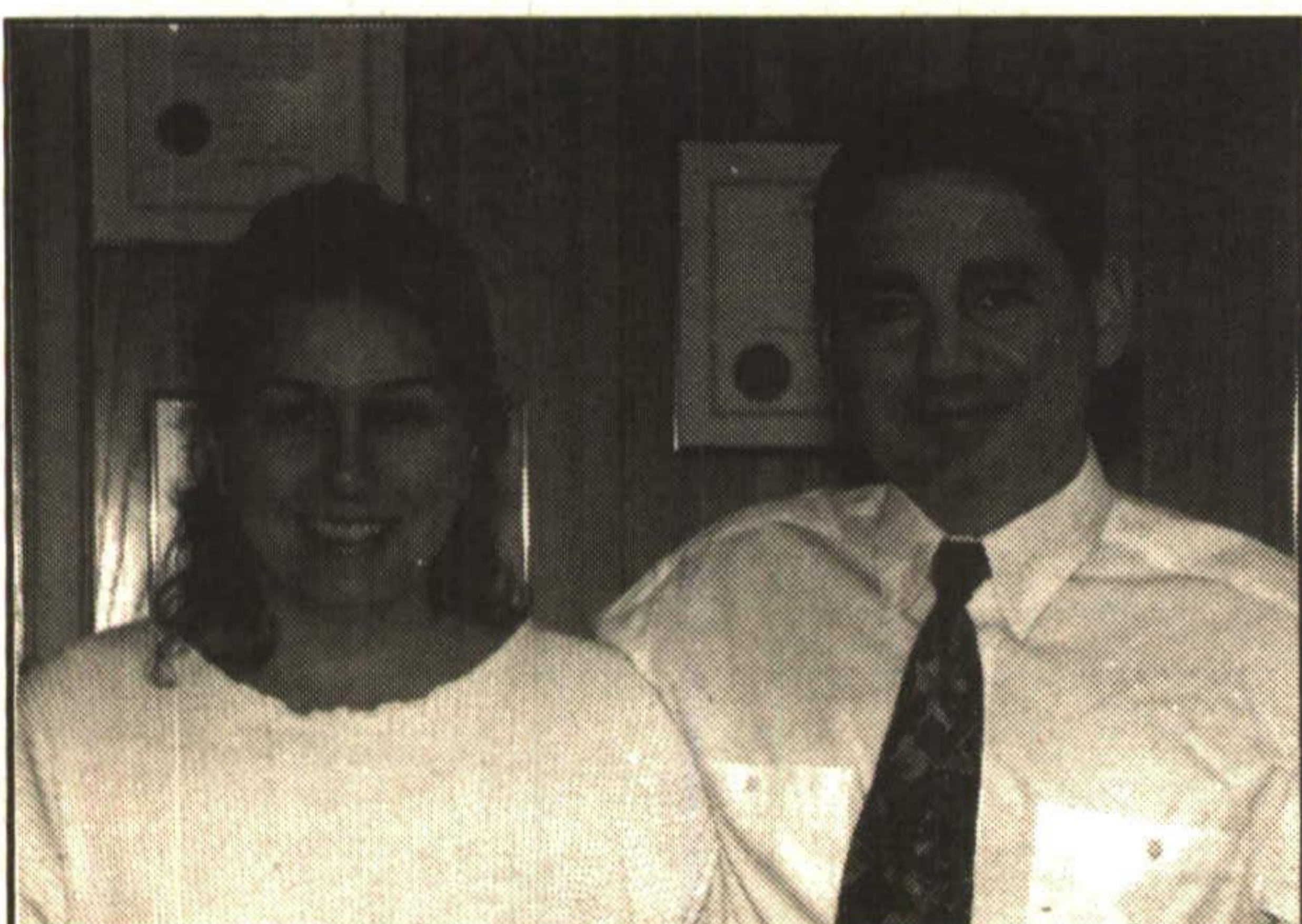
furniture.
