It is possible a young couple walking along an Acton street interrupted a burglary last month, and were assaulted themselves as a result.

Crimes Stoppers is seeking information that could lead to the identification of the person responsible.

In the early morning of August 20, a young man and woman were walking along Mill Street near Bower Street when they noticed a man peering into the front door to the Entertainment Tonight Video store.

Thinking the suspect may be preparing to break into the store, one of the victims shouted to him. The culprit approached the pair, and was able to strike one with a metal pipe before they were able to flee to a friend's home.

The man sought was described to police as white, 20 to 30 years of age, 5'7" tall with a slim build. He had a moustache and long dark hair, and wore a white "Nazareth" T-shirt.
