defends his shop the best way he can against robbers, fires a gun, and he is charged as if he were the criminal.



Finally, the pathetic attempt by the prosecutor of Paul Bernardo to get some mileage out of a case that could have


been handled by any first year law student, with the same result. No jury needs any help in interpreting what they saw on those horrific video tapes.
