Police are investigating the incident, and said two youths between 12 and 15 were seen entering the building between 4 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. Wednesday.

Vandalism


Guelph St. business overnight Tuesday by slipping the lock. The business was vandalized and an answering machine was taken, police said.

WHAT IS HEARING LOSS?

There are two types of hearing loss:

Conductive

② Sensorineural

HOW WE LOSE OUR HEARING:

A conductive hearing loss occurs when sound waves are not being conducted properly through the outer or middle ears. Conductive hearing loss can be caused by wax in the ear canal, fluid in the middle ear or ear infections. Often, conductive hearing loss can be alleviated by surgical or medical procedures.

Sensorineural hearing loss occurs when damage has been done to the hair cells or the nerve fibers in the inner ear. Causes may include prolonged exposure to hazardous noise, high fevers, birth defects, head injury or merely the aging process. Sensorineural hearing loss can be helped with hearing instruments.
