"Homophobia is a great barrier to effective AIDS education. Many people still believe that if they are not gay, they are not at any risk of acquiring HIV...Many people do not want to discuss gay or lesbian sexuality, at a time when we need to adress sexuality in all of its diversity in order to be effective in prevention efforts," says Bruce Clarke, an educator with the Halton Regional Health Department, AIDS Program. "Homophobia and AIDS are firmly linked in the minds of many Canadians...In too many cases, homophobia has a negative impact on

surrounding HIV and AIDS. The goal of this year's campaign is For the 1995 AIDS Awareness to work towards removing the stigma Campaign, the Canadian AIDS Society surrounding the disease, encouraging a more compassionate, humane response to gay people and all people living with HIV/AIDS in Canada.

"Homophobia is everyone's problem," says Clarke. "Like other kinds of prejudice, it's learned."

Two all-day workshops on working with gay, lesbian and bisexual youth for people who work with youth in Halton Region were organized by the Halton Regional Health Department, a Sexual Health and AIDS Programs was held on October 2 and 3, at the Halton Regional Centre, 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville.

The Health Department is also holding a forum for family physicians, to be held in Oakville on October 11. Area libraries were displaying and distributing information on HIV/AIDS during AIDS Awareness Week.


