# Raiders skate to win over Derbys

The Georgetown Raiders reaped the rewards of another big effort Tuesday night in Streetsville, with a 5-3 win over the Derbys.

The victory, their second of the young season, came courtesy of three consistent periods of work - something the Raiders have been seriously lacking over the past three years. The win ups their record to 2-3 (with one of the losses in overtime).

"The guys played well tonight, at both ends of the ice. They're really playing as a team," said Raiders general manager Jules Russiani.

Newly acquired centre Steve Guiney proved to be the hero of the game. In his third game since coming over from Burlington, Guiney unloaded with a wristshot for the game winner at 4:33 of the third.

He then took a nice centering pass from rookie

winger Sandro Mignosa and potted an insurance marker at 16:03.

Picking up assists on both his goals was Victor Cizmarik.

The Raiders staked themselves to an early 2-0 lead in the opening 10 minutes of the contest and held on to a 2-1 lead by first period's end. The teams exchanged goals in the middle frame, with Georgetown's tally coming on the powerplay from Dave

D'Ammizio at 5:25.

Team discipline has also been a key strength for the local Junior A crew so far. The Raiders took only three minor penalties all night, and none in the first 30 minutes.

They were beat on one of their penalties, on a rebound shot by Svad Cejvanovic early in the third.

"We also got big games from some of the guys who didn't score, including Will Pomp and

Curtis Carr," added Russiani. "We need these type of players doing their jobs in order to win games."

Working the net for his second victory this season was Jonathan McCarthy, who allowed one goal in each period.

Counting other goals for Georgetown were defenseman Dan Gilpin and sophomore Brad Cripps, his first of the year. Recording other helpers were D'Ammizio, David Bouskill and Jamie Schuring.

Derbys star forward Derek Wells was in on all three of his teams goals. He scored in the first and helped set up the other two by Cejvanovic and Jeff White.

The Raiders took on the Merchants in Milton Friday and hosted Bramalea last night (Saturday). They take on the Chargers in Mississauga tomorrow evening (Monday).

Their next home game is Saturday, October 14 against Brampton.

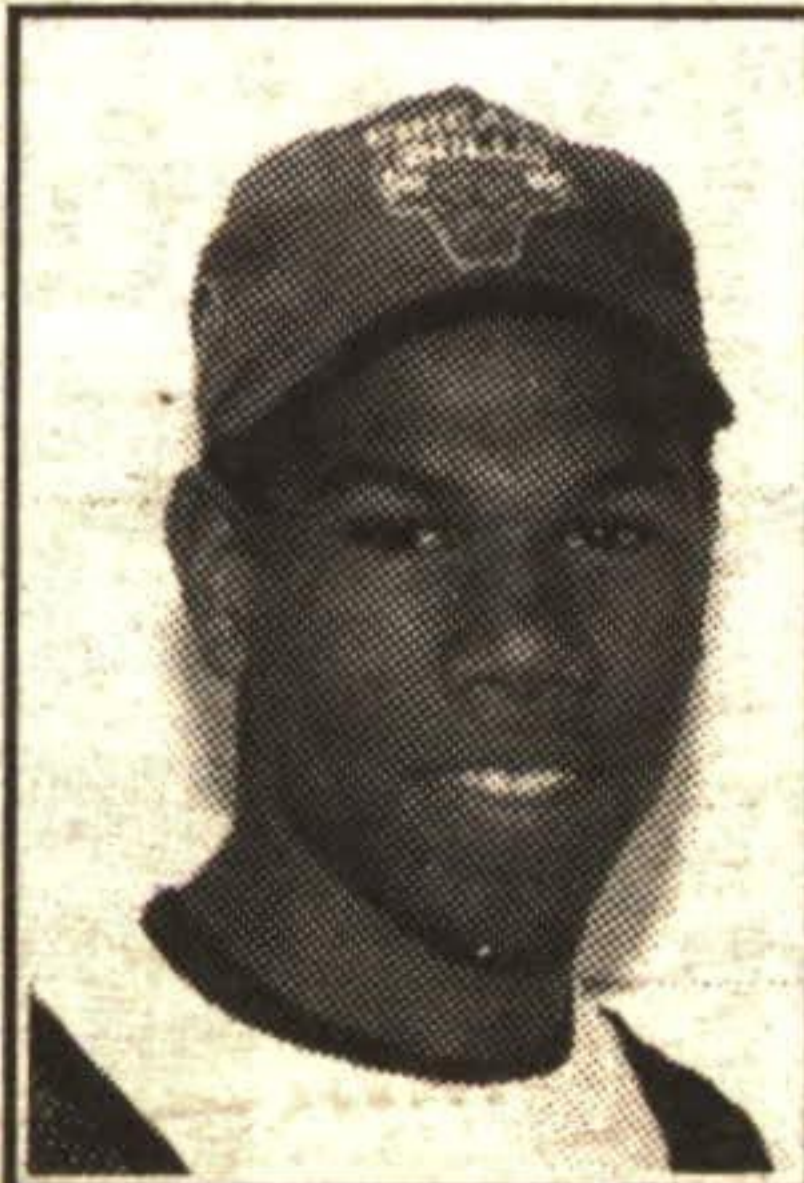
