#### Trio sought



# Voters set to elect new trustee

Monday will be decision day for Wards 1 and 2 residents as they head to polls to choose their new Halton School board trustee.

Eight area residents are vying for the position which was vacated earlier this year by Dave Whiting. In the running for the job are: Gary Crosbie, Ethel Gardiner, Jake Kuiken, Susan McPhail Job, John Morton, Ron Nelson, Elly Tuitman and Ria Wilson.

The 19 polling stations in the wards open at 10 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. Two advance polls were held last Saturday and Wednesday.

Qualified voters who did not receive their voter notification cards in the mail are likely not on the voters list. To be eligible to vote they can

visit the Clerk's department at the Civic Centre to have their name added to the list or be sworn in at their poll. Identification may be requested, a tax bill usually serves the purpose Electors who ar

purpose. Electors who aren't certain which polling station they are to vote at should call the Clerk's office at 873-2600.

Polling station 5 will be located in the Ballinafad United Church basement, 6 and 7 will be in Glen Williams Town Hall, 8 and 9 at Limehouse Public School, 10, 11 and 12 at M.Z. Bennett Public School, 13 at Norval Community Centre, 14 and 15 at Pineview Public School, 16, 17 and 18 at Robert Little Public School, 19, 20 and 21 at the Royal Canadian Legion in Acton and 22 and 23 at Stewarttown Public School.

Election night results as they come in will be posted on a screen in the council chambers at the Civic Centre beginning shortly after the polls close.

For those who want to view the results from their own home, Cable Four will superimpose the updated results over its regular programming. Final results will be included in the public service announcement messages.
