LEARNING TO LIVE WITH DENTURES

Learning to live with dentures often requires a period of adjustment. It doesn't matter how much difficulty one experiences at first, as you will gradually learn to use false teeth. A few denture wearers do not assume the right mental attitude, and without giving their new teeth a fair trial, begin to think their case is hopeless. These few people will never learn how to wear dentures unless they make up their minds to conquer their difficulty. Remember, it takes about four times longer to master a lower denture than an upper denture.

Also, it is important to remember that it isn't always the person with the smallest quantity of gum or ridges that is the hardest to fit, and who apparently would have the most problems. These people usually realize that their case is more difficult, and knowing this, are prepared for anything. When they get their dentures, they find that denture wearing isn't as bad as they feared.
