A boat and trailer have gone missing from a farm in rural North Halton, and Crime Stoppers hopes someone knows where they may be found.

During the Labor Day weekend of September 1st through 4th, someone entered a farm on Trafalgar Road north of the 401, and drove off with a trailer and the boat it carried.

The boat was described as a Regal Sebring 19 ft. long, blue

on top and white on the bottom, with an inboard/outboard motor. The vessel itself was valued at several thousands of dollars.

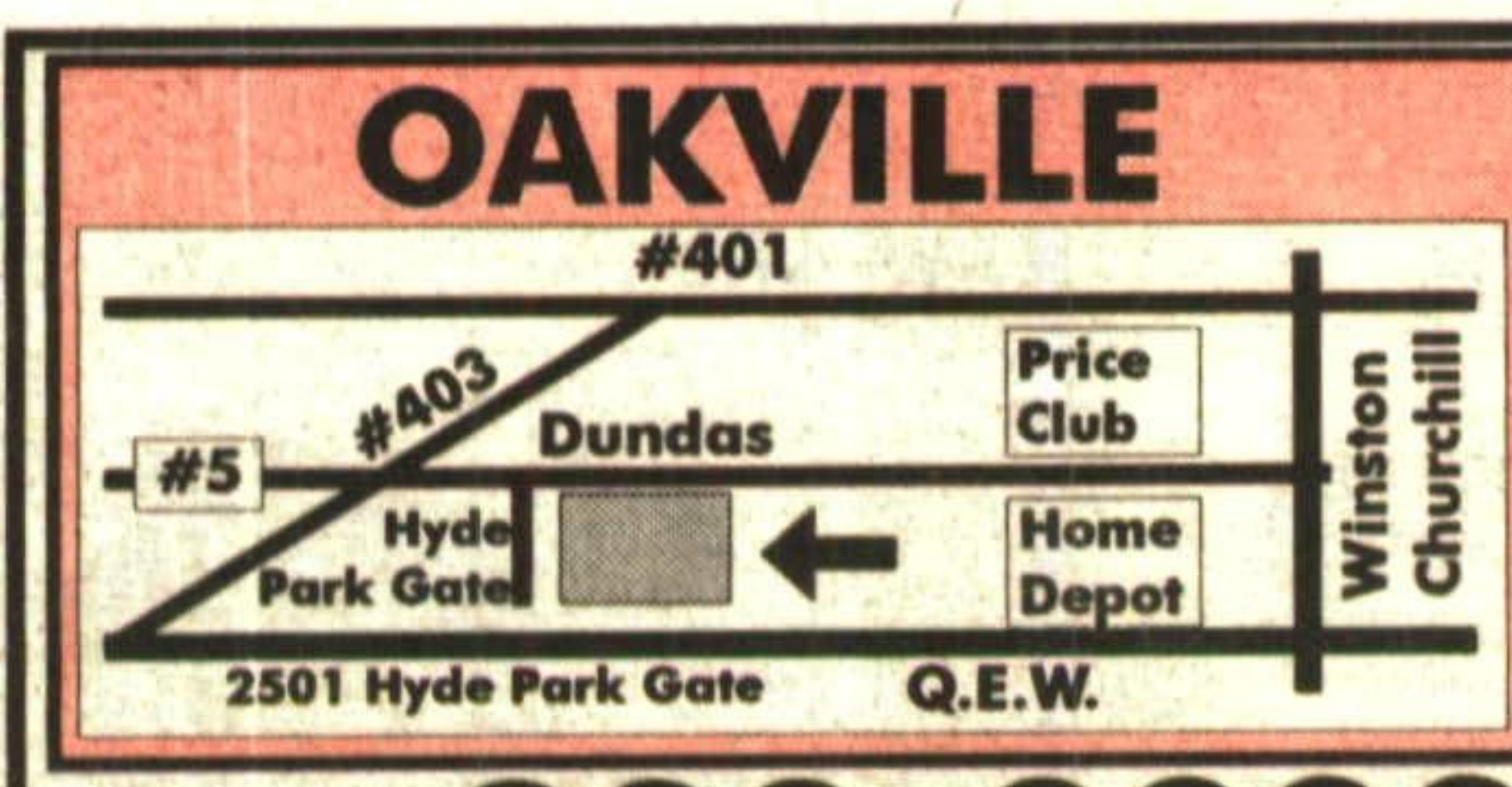
