Mabel Newman celebrated her 100th birthday with family and friends at the Acton Legion October 29. Five generations were in attendance including great, great grandson Devon Woodward who born in 1995, is 100 years younger than his great great grandmother.

As well on Wednesday, October 25 Mrs. Newman celebrated in the chronic care wing at Milton District Hospital, where she has been residing since October 1991.

That party was hosted by the Milton District Hospital Auxiliary, and Mrs. Newman even did a little singing and dancing with members of the Milton Seniors Orchestra who were on hand for their monthly performance.

"I was so surprised, I had no idea they were doing anything like this," said Mrs. Newman.

Born Mabel Irene Dennison in Erindale, she has lived in the area her entire life. Her ancestors hailed from England.

She and her late husband Norman worked side by side on a fruit farm in Streetsville for many years before moving to Speyside in 1974. The couple enjoyed over 70 years of marriage before Norman passed away.

Her family now includes both great grandchildren and even great, great grandchildren.

Her old home in Streetsville still stands, she recalled, with a big oak tree and a tree house in the front yard. She says she has seen a lot over the years, realizing the number of changes are too vast to mention.

"I don't know if I have a secret to a long life. I've been lucky enough to know everything that's going on around me. God has blessed me," she said.
