The eight acre parcel of land where the new Acton arena is to be built has been purchased by the

The property, located on the north side of Hwy. 7 south of the high school, cost the town \$160,000 in late September and the deal is to close shortly.

Paul Stover, superintendent of facilities with the town said the town has submitted its \$1.3 million grant application to the province for the arena and is awaiting a response.

"The application was filed under the JobsOntario program (which was canceled when the Harris government took office) and we are

hoping there is something replacing it," said Stover.

The facility, which is to include a 190 or 200 ft by 85 ft ice surface, community hall and seniors area, is earmarked to cost \$5.1 million.

Stover said without the provincial contribution there will be a big hole in the town's funding. Town staff is currently looking at alternative ways to fund the facility.

A meeting with the Acton developers and the town will be held at Halton Region on Tuesday Nov. 14 to coordinate a funding plan to cover the costs of the sewage treatment plant expansion required for the growth in the Acton east area.

Benson Leung, research engineer with Halton Region, said the

developers have been presented with alternative funding formulas and a counter-offer is expected from the developers at the meeting.

Earlier the expansion was estimated to cost \$2.5 million. Leung said the region is currently updating that estimate which will also be presented to the developers at the Nov. 14 meeting.

"The (current) taxpayers are not going to pay for the expansion. They (the Acton developers) will all have to help fund the project," said

Leung said at this point only two of the smaller developers, Acto II, and Dawkins, have shown an interest in building soon.

Stover said the town is "a small player in the whole scheme."


