

# Organizing committee searching for Classic volunteers

The annual Classics Against Cancer car show needs volunteers.

"We're looking for a number of different people, with varied skills and contacts to better promote the show," says Alan Ryall, co-chairman responsible for sponsorship of the show held

every Father's Day at Cedarvale Park, Georgetown.

Ryall says he is looking to fill at least two key positions within the group.

The first centers around one of the greatest challenges of the show, coordinating the public relations and advertising for the show.

"The ideal person would be someone who works in the

marketing or public relations field," says Ryall.

Ryall hopes this volunteer would develop a plan to acquire effective advertising, (both paid and free) for the show, as well as gain maximum return on the advertising dollar. In addition, he hopes to build increased awareness for the show, through contacts with the local and Toronto-based electronic and

print media, as well as distribute press releases and coordinate media coverage.

The second position needed is a volunteers coordinator, someone who possesses a high degree of organization, and can coordinate volunteers to reach the many local sponsors associated with the show, to gain as much sponsorship as possible for the show, in addition to giving the

sponsors maximum exposure for their donations.

Last year's Classics Against Cancer Show generated more than \$30,000 for Cancer research and the show has raised well over \$120,000 since it started seven years ago.

## Behavior is frustrating

Smoking, snowballs and sassy behavior on the part of some GDHS students continue to frustrate school staff and the community.

Only a small minority of students are involved in unacceptable behaviour on the property or in the neighborhood. The vast majority of GDHS students are good citizens, and as upset as anyone else when the good name of the school is threatened by the behavior of a few irresponsible students.

Additional supervision has supported enforcement of the no-smoking requirement and helped deal with traffic and behavioral problems. However, staff cannot consistently "police" our driveway, extensive grounds, and bus area.

In their out-of-class time, school staff are already scheduled for

supervision in the cafeteria, for class coverage of absent staff, and in the supervised study room — as well as doing extra-curricular activities.

For students who are creating problems off-site, we can do little unless it is within the school day and we know the identity of the students. Not every teenager in town is a student at GDHS!

After additional discussions at our Parent Advisory and community subcommittee, a survey on the smoking issue was conducted. Once the data is collated, we will have a clear picture about the views of the staff and students, all of whom were polled, and, hopefully, additional ideas for resolving the problems.

Education about the hazards of smoking is ongoing; most recently our Peer Mentors and staff advisors organized an information assembly for the Grade 9s.
