It is located on 96 acres and shares the campus with the E.C. Drury High School (for hearing high school aged students). Dedicated deaf,

hard of hearing and hearing teachers work together to meet the needs of the students. Some students commute from their homes on a daily basis, others stay five days per week returning home every weekend. Transportation to and from school for all students in arranged by the local school board, at no cost to parents. The following areas are eligible

to apply for admission Simcoe, Dufferin, Peel, Halton, Waterloo and Wellington counties, York region, Niagara Peninsula and Hamilton Wentworth areas. Sign language interpreters are available here.
