Former mayor Steamer Emmerson dies

The former mayor of Georgetown and the 1984 Citizen of the Year Wheldon (Steamer) Emmerson died at his home Wednesday.

Emmerson, 71, who was Georgetown's mayor in 1969 and 1970, is survived by his wife Muriel Hewson and his son, daughter-in-law and granddaughter, Blake, Leesa and Amanda. He is also survived by

his brother Steven of Acton and sister Lois Teesdale of Brampton.


Emmerson entered municipal politics in 1966 and before becoming the town's mayor he worked as an assistant administrator at Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital.

After his term as mayor Emmerson worked for 10 years as the deputy sheriff of Halton County. He retired from that position in 1980.

Emmerson was very active in his community over the years. An award in Emmerson's name, in recognition of his work with organization, is given annually to the Halton Hills Chapter of the Heart and Stroke Foundation's volunteer of the year. In 1992

Emmerson received a commemorative Canada 125 medal in recognition of his significant contribution to his country, community and compatriots.

Friends were received at the J.S. Jones and Son Funeral Home on Thursday. The funeral and committal service was held in the chapel on Friday afternoon.
