A school in the Georgetown area of Halton Hills has started the new year with a shortage of computers after a burglary, and investigators would appreciate hearing from anyone who may be able to help get the equipment back.

On Jan. 2, someone forced a window at the rear of Pineview Public School on 5 Sideroad. It is believed the entry was made shortly before 6:45 a.m. Once inside, the thief entered two classrooms and took a total of four Apple computer hard drives, monitors, keyboards and a printer.

The initial police estimate for the value of the stolen property was placed about \$6,000.

Crime Stoppers would be interested in hearing from anyone who may know who is responsible for this entry, or from someone who may have information about the vehicle used to carry the equipment off.


knocking it down. The driver was charged with careless driving and failing to report damage.


