

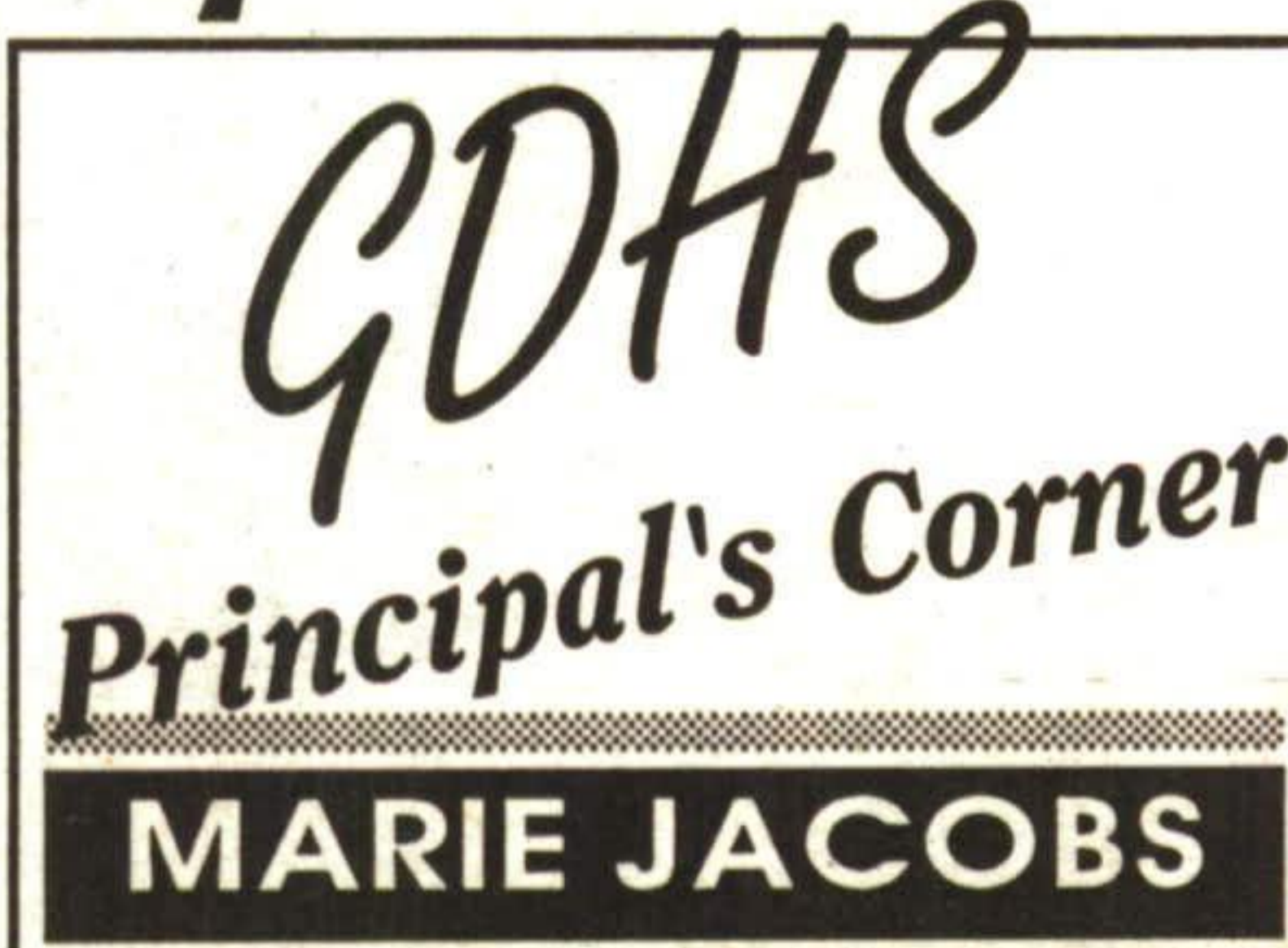
Now is the time to sign up for French Immersion studies

February is the month to register for the following year of French Immersion studies at the elementary level. Option sheets for Grade 9 should already have been returned.

Early Immersion begins in Grade 1 at George Kennedy School in Georgetown. Another opportunity for additional studies in the French language is Grade 7 where students may begin Late Immersion at Stewarttown School.

Applications are due in the respective schools in early February. Both streams can move on to immersion studies in high school. At GDHS, more than 200 students are enrolled in immersion programs.

Students in Early Immersion accumulate 5,000 hours of studies over their school career and take 10 of their high school courses in French; the respective numbers for Late Immersion are 2,100 hours and seven courses. Students



completing these programs receive the Halton Certificate of Immersion Studies.

Fluency in French is not accomplished at the expense of English. One of the benefits of Halton French Immersion programs is that students spend one-half of the day in studies in each of English and French, developing skills in both languages simultaneously. The results of the most recent Ontario Grade 9 Reading and Writing Test verify that immersion students perform well above the provincial average in English.

A second language provides access to expanded educational and employment opportunities. In both the Canadian and global marketplaces, for example, bilingual employees are sought after.

Do consider immersion studies for your children. Programs run only if there is sufficient enrolment. Call Mrs. Bentley at the school if you wish more information about French Immersion programs.

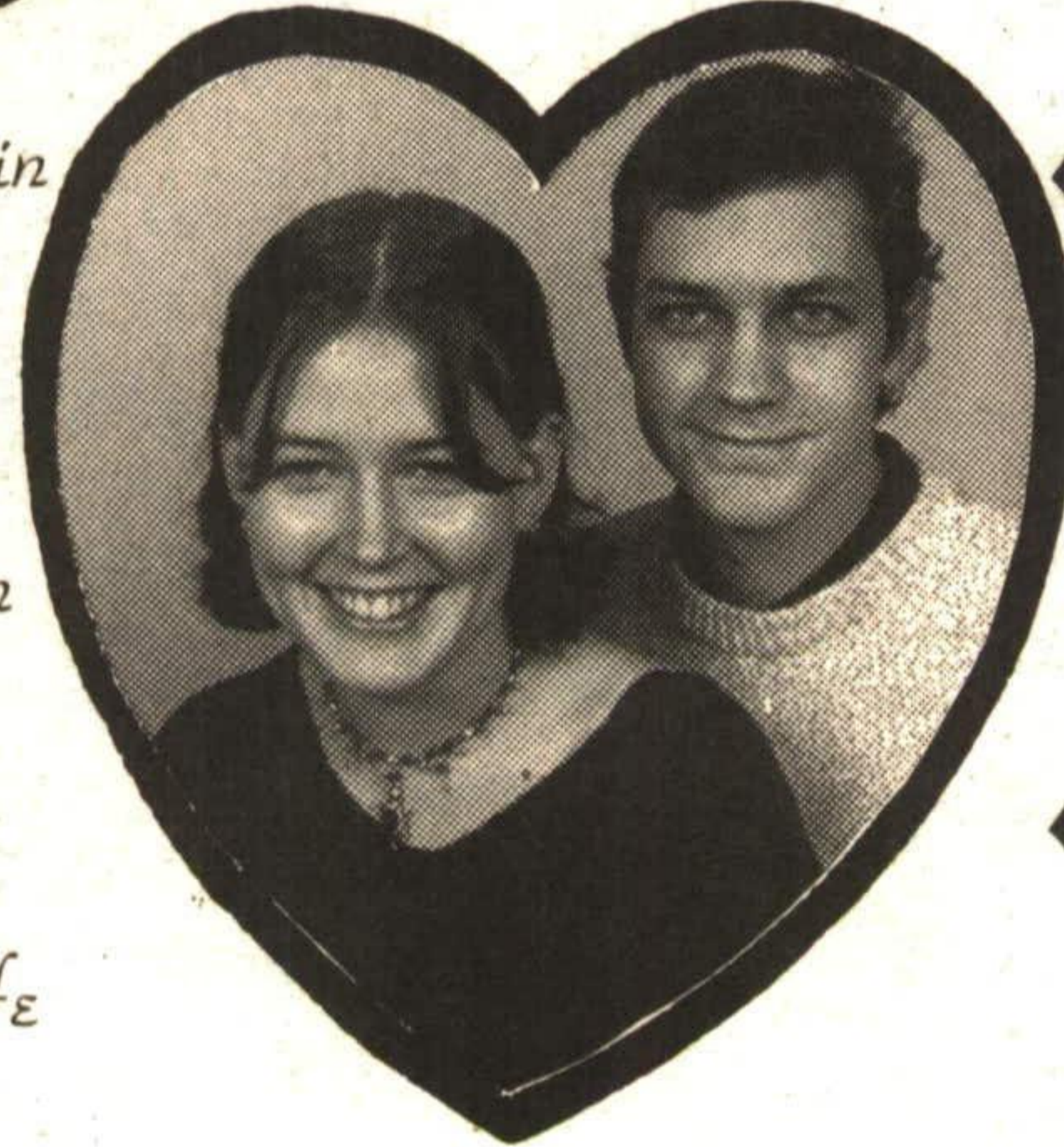

Lorne Scots now offer high school co-op

High school students interested in a co-op program that combines school with basic military training are invited to attend an orientation session held every Thursday evening at 7:30 p.m. at the Brampton Armoury.

The Armoury is located at 12 Chapel St., next to the Brampton Library.

The co-op program is offered by The Lorne Scots Regiment, working in conjunction with the Dufferin-Peel Roman Catholic Separate School Board, the Peel Regional Board of Education, the northern schools of the Halton School Board, and the Dufferin County Board of Education.

To be eligible, students must have a minimum of 15 credits, be at least 17 years old, and be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant.

Not only will this program enable students to receive four credits towards their diploma, but will also give them

valuable practical skills, such as first aid, leadership and discipline. They will also have the opportunity to earn some funds during the after school hours of their four month placement.

Upon completion of their internship, the candidates will be eligible for full-time paid employment for the months of July and August.

The Lorne Scots are also seeking university students with leadership capabilities to enrol in the Canadian Armed Forces RESO program.

The program guarantees full-time summer employment for the duration of at least two years. Positions are limited, so prospective candidates are asked to apply soon in order to guarantee positions for this summer.
