

GDHS teachers keep busy during 'prep' time

GDHS Principal's Corner

I thought the community would be interested in knowing what duties GDHS teachers perform during "prep" and lunch times.

They:

- teach the classes of other teachers who: * Are involved with students in out-of-class educational experiences such as field trips, athletic events, band performances, guest speakers/assemblies, etc. * Must

- be freed up for some reason such as to provide first aid, meet with a parent, attend a case conference and so on. * Are observing another class or team-teaching. * Are taken ill during the day. * Are participating in conferences or workshops.

- supervise students: on a rotational basis throughout the year, the teachers are assigned supervision on school property. They monitor student behavior inside and outside the building; e.g. ensuring smoking is off the

- grounds, checking for trespassers outside the building and supervising halls, "supervised study" and the cafeteria (in a large school, not all students can have lunch at the same time; at GDHS, 3 of the 5 instructional periods are also lunch periods for some students and staff).

- set up/maintain classroom materials and equipment: e.g. sewing machines, lathes, computers, audio-visual equipment, materials for laboratory experiments, art

materials and so on!

- do classroom-related work: prepare lessons and learning activities, assignments and tests; mark; review texts/videos/software, and complete reports.

- confer with parents (e.g. about absences, progress), administrators or support staff (e.g., about student issues), heads/administration (e.g., about performance appraisal), other teachers (e.g., about curriculum planning) and students (e.g., give

extra help).

- perform administrative duties (e.g. complete required forms), do committee work (e.g., on Awards, School Goals committees) and organize fundraising (e.g., order cheese/fruit/chocolate for sales).

Teachers engage in many of these same activities outside the school day as well as taking on extra-curricular responsibilities coaching sports, sponsoring students clubs, and supervising students event such as dances.

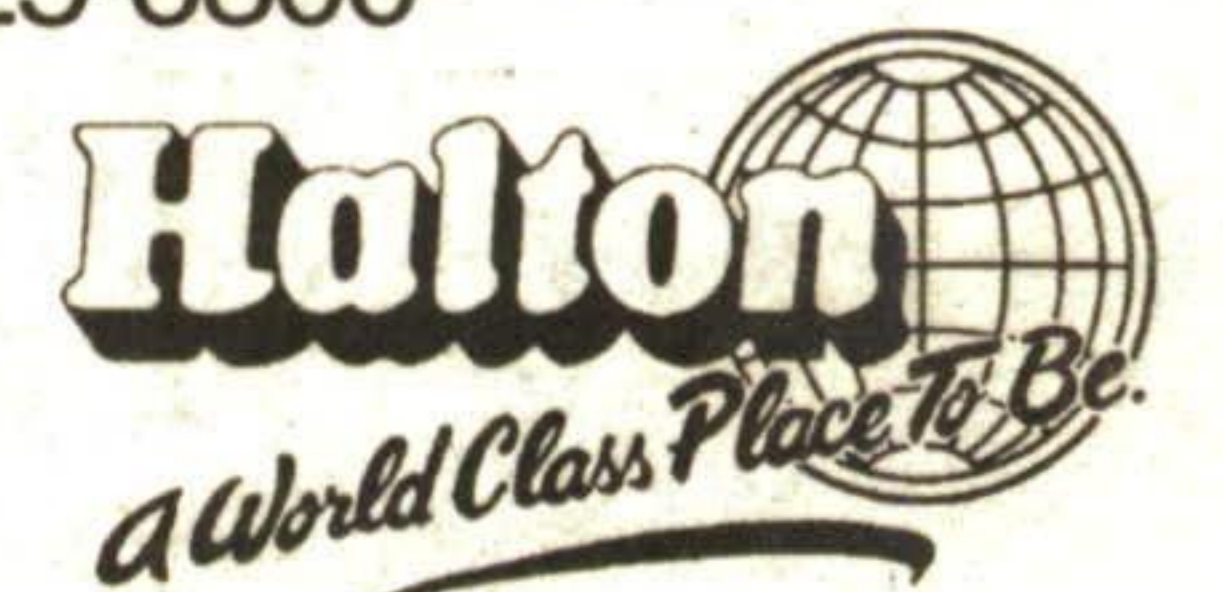
