Raiders pull off upsets in OMHA playoffs

The Georgetown Raiders might well become the upset kings in the Ontario Minor Hockey Association this season.

The Raiders have pulled off some surprising victories in the opening round of the Ontario playdowns, with four squads upsetting Tricounty rivals.

The Peewee II Raiders have been on a tear in post-season.

After going winless in 28 regular season games the Georgetown Chiropractic & Sports Injuries squad stunned Orangeville in the opening round, winning the best-of three series in three games. They have since eliminated Owen Sound 3-1 and are set to battle Oakville.

The minor atom Raiders shocked first place Orangeville on Tuesday night, claiming a 3-2

series win with a 2-1 overtime decision. The win gives the Raiders a second round bye and a berth in the OMHA semi-finals.

The Sports Unlimted major atoms also chipped in with a first round upset, knocking off Brampton 3-1 in games. The Raiders finished fifth while Brampton had claimed second in the regular season. They now meet St. Catharines in quarter-final action.

The Charley Fitzwhiskey major peewees Raiders also turned in an impressive first round performace, downing Milton 3-2 in their best of five affair. The sixth-place Raiders downed the Winterhawks 5-3 in the final game. They will battle Oakville in the OMHA quarter-finals.

The other Raider squads still in the hunt for OMHA titles include the major novices, who swept Burlington 3-0 in the opening round and the minor peewees, who finished first in the regular season and earned a first round bye.

The major novices now meet Orangeville in the Zone quarter-finals while the minor peewees await the winner of Oakville and Orangeville in their quarter-final.

The minor novice Raiders lost a 3-2 series heartbreaker to Hespeler in first round action while the minor bnatams lost their best-of-five match to Owen Sound 3-1. The major bantams fell 2-1 in their series to Milton while the midgets were swept 3-0 by Hespeler.

Oakville had the number of Georgetown's additional entry squads, the novice IIs fell 3-0 in their series. The atom IIs dropped a 2-0 series

decision.
