AAA rating

Halton's AAA credit rating has been reconfirmed by the Canadian Bond Rating Service (CBRS) on the heels of the reconfirmation of the rating by Moody's Investor Service earlier this month.

In awarding the rating CBRS pointed to Halton's prudent which budget practices anticipated provincial transfer cuts, its proactive reorganization plan and the region's growing economic base. The AAA rating is the highest assessment of credit strength assigned by the rating agencies.

Gulley verdict in Acton arson

At 6 p.m. Thursday, the 12member jury found Ken and Joan Thomson guilty.

The Thomsons each faced one count of arson endangering life and one count of arson with intent to commit fraud in the fire at their Young St., Acton home on Jan. 24,

May 24 has been set aside for their sentencing and the Thomsons are free until then.

Crown Attorney James Cornish said Friday the Thomsons could receive anything from a suspended sentence to 14 years in jail for the more serious charge of arson endangering life while arson with intent to defraud carries a sentence of up to 10 years. On May 24, will Cornish make recommendation on sentencing to Justice David S. Crane, as will lawyers Doug Lent, who represents Ken Thomson and Jack McCulligh, who represents Joan Thomson.

"The jury did their job," said Crown Attorney James Cornish. He added they "obviously listened."


The jury began deliberating Thursday morning and came back to the courtroom at around 2:15 p.m., asking to hear evidence given by witness William Dumarsh, a neighbor who testified he saw two people at 6:10 p.m. in the Thomson's driveway. One person went back and forth to the house bringing things to the car while the second paced in the driveway. Dumarsh didn't say this was the Thomsons, but he couldn't say it was not, either.
