Local schools eliminated

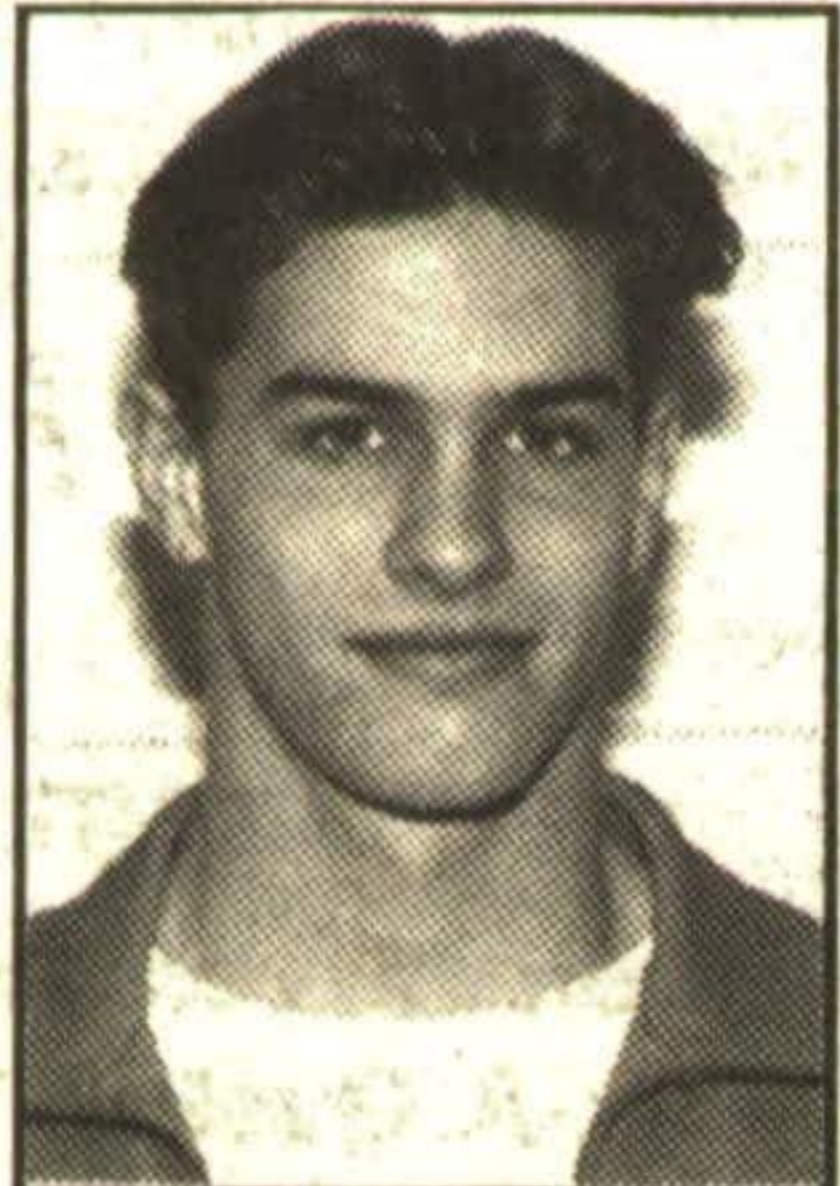
