Hearing date set

A joint board will hold a preliminary hearing regarding the Reclamation Systems Inc. proposal to establish a waste disposal site in the Acton Quarry on Tuesday, October 22.

The hearing will be held at the Acton Royal Canadian Legion, 15 Wright Ave., at 10 a.m. If necessary it will continue October 23.

The preliminary hearing is to hear submissions from those seeking party or participant status at the hearing, identify the issues to be considered at the hearing, plan the pre-hearing process, discuss intervenor funding issues and deal with any other matters.

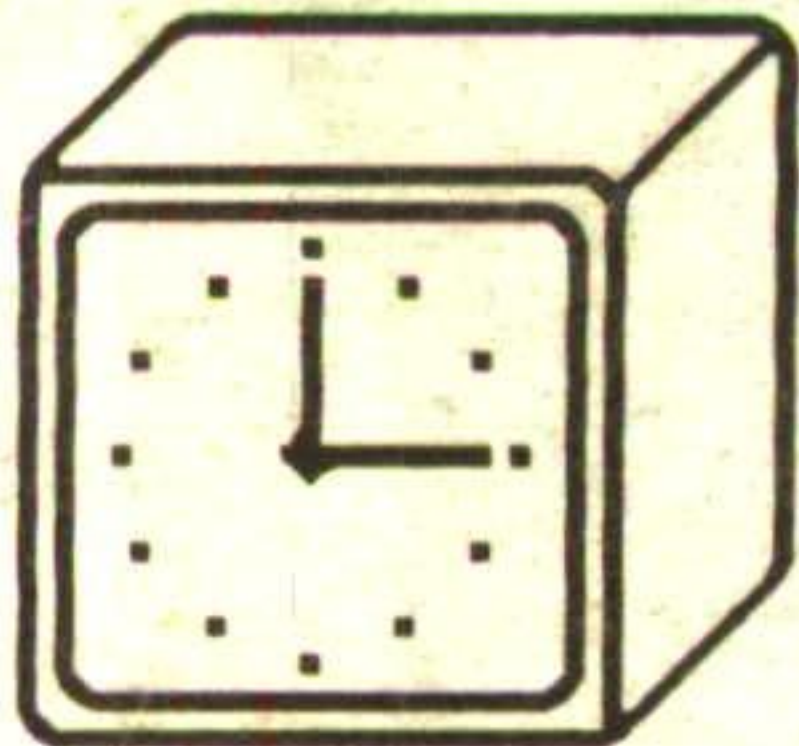
The joint board consists of members of the Environmental Assessment Board and the Ontario Municipal Board.

Milton gets new police station

Over Halton Hills mayor Marilyn Serjeantson's objections, Halton regional council approved the construction of a new police station in Milton.

The station, to cost almost \$2.9 million will be located on the Allendale campus.

Halton police chief Peter Campbell said no current plans exist for the service to close its Georgetown station, however he would not rule it out as a possibility when faced with anticipated budget constraints.

Construction of the Allendale station is slated to begin in this month with the building opening in January 1997. The project is financed by \$2 million from the Canada-Ontario infrastructure works program, almost \$1.1 million from development charges, \$279,000 from reserves and \$387,000 borrowed.



Mayor Serjeantson objects to station

According to a report by Joe Rinaldo, Halton commissioner of corporate services, the design was completed in last October and tenders called. When all seven companies came in with tenders much higher than the \$2.8 million estimated for the project, negotiations began with the lowest bidder to revise the design to bring the building costs down.

Approved changes include: elimination of basement, removal of two bay windows, a different security system, deletion of skylights and replacement of sod with grass seeding.
