## Rams and Gators join forces

Local lacrosse associations are hoping bigger is better.

The Acton and Georgetown Lacrosse Associations have combined forces to create a larger Halton Hills house league system.

"Both towns really needed the numbers to build up the house league," said George Artem, president of the Acton Lacrosse Association. "Getting lacrosse sticks in the kids' hands, that's our main focus."

It is hoped that with a larger house league system in place, players will be encouraged to pick up the game because they won't have to start on a town's rep team.

"They won't be scared that they're not going to make (the rep team)," Artem said. "I think it will be more positive for the (new) players."

Association president Gerry Veltman believes the larger house league will be a great benefit in helping players develop their skills.

"Instead of adding players to the teams we had we'll be able to make a fourth team and shorten the benches so the kids will get more playing time."

The towns will maintain separate rep programs. Acton only had rep teams last season while Georgetown had 148 players with only three house

league teams in most divisions.
By combining forces there will
be 240 house league players and
each division, except bantam,
will have four teams. That will
allow each team to play once a
week.

This year's registration almost triples Georgetown's inaugural in 1994 when it had 84 players. And the numbers could still grow.

"We had eight or nine (new) kids come to the clinic (on Saturday)," Veltman said. "I've had a few more calls since then, too."

Artem said with the partnership coming together close to the beginning of the season, there wasn't much time to advertise the house league


program in Acton. He expects to see many new players in the coming years.

The two associations decided against putting all the Acton players on one team. Instead they have been divided amongst the four teams.

"I think it's a definite advantage to the kids," said Artem. "They'll get to play against some of their friends and they'll get to meet some new people and make new friends."

All games will be played on Saturday mornings and both Acton and Alcott Arena in Georgetown will host games.

The 10-week regular season started Saturday and will wrap up with a one-day Day of Champions.

Geared towards hockey players between six to 12 years of age, this intense one-week training program will be held August 26-30 at Gordon Alcott Arena in Georgetown.




The school will be limited to the first 80 hockey players who




## Talents on display




### Athletes of the Week
