Continued from page 18 #11 Erin Heights - Par 3,

170 yards Depending on the wind this hole can require anything from a six iron to a three wood. The green is well protected with bunkers on the right and a pot bunker at the back of the green.

#11 North Halton - Par 4,

311 yards

Hitting from an elevated tee you must avoid a large second shot requires you to hit over a large creek to a surrounded green bunkers.

#12 North Halton - Par 5,

540 yards

A double dog leg to the right with a narrow fairway that requires an acurate tee shot. The entire left side from the 150 yard marker out is out of bounds.

#12 Blue Springs - Par 5, 515 yards

A picturesque hole that runs through a valley, it will test your accuracy. A narrow fairway that is lined with trees on both sides, trap on the left side. The leads to a small, well bunkered green.

#14 Georgetown - Par 3,

162 yards

Tee shot carries over a gorge to the green, as long as you don't leave it short, that is.


#17 Georgetown - Par 5, 501 yards

A long dog leg with many mature trees which block your path to the green on your second shot. It will likely take most golfers three to reach the elevated green.

#17 Hornby Towers - Par 3, 149 yards

Your tee shot must carry over water to a large green. The hole is especially tough if the pin is located in the back left side of the green.
