Bike-a-thon

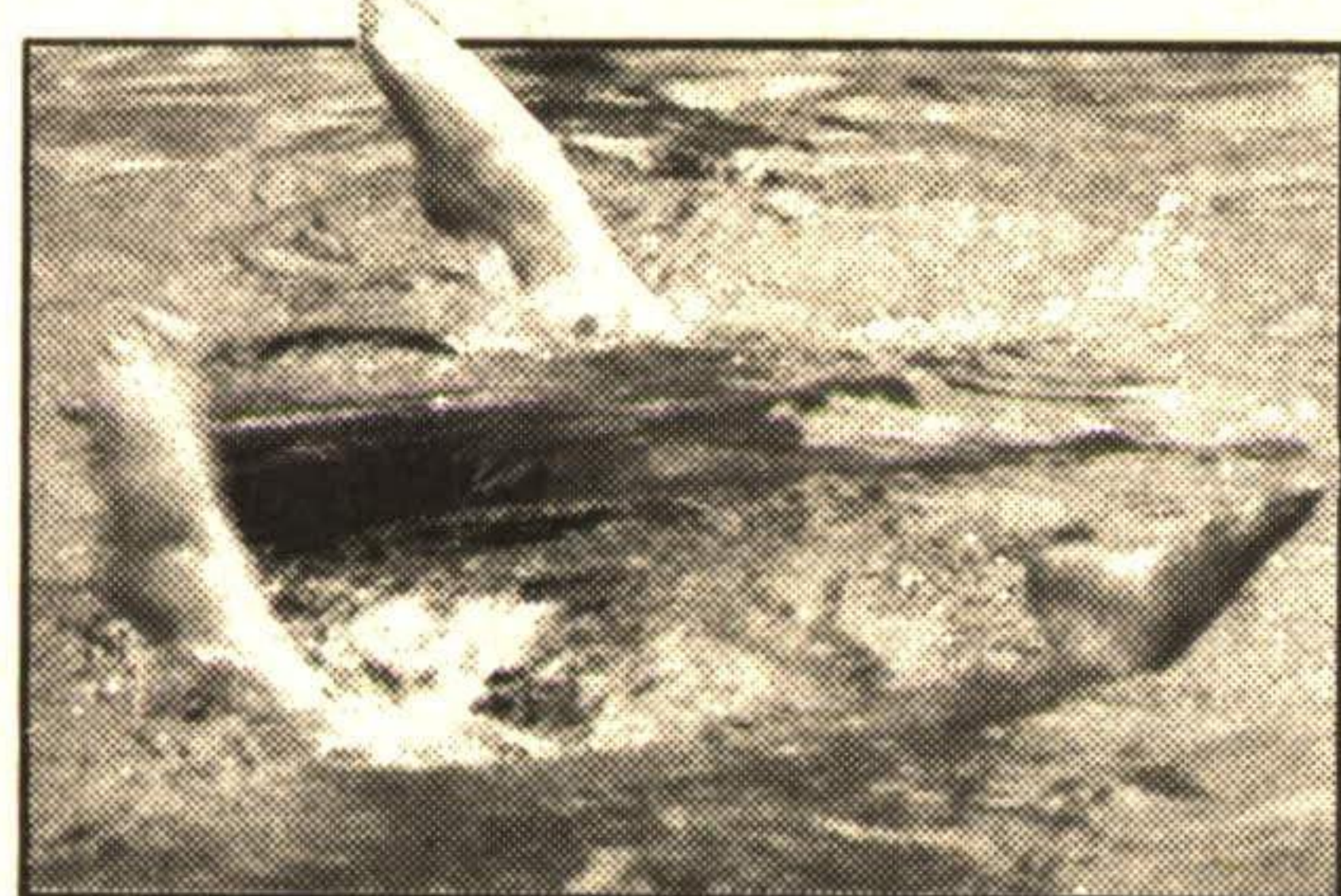

Bulldogs battle

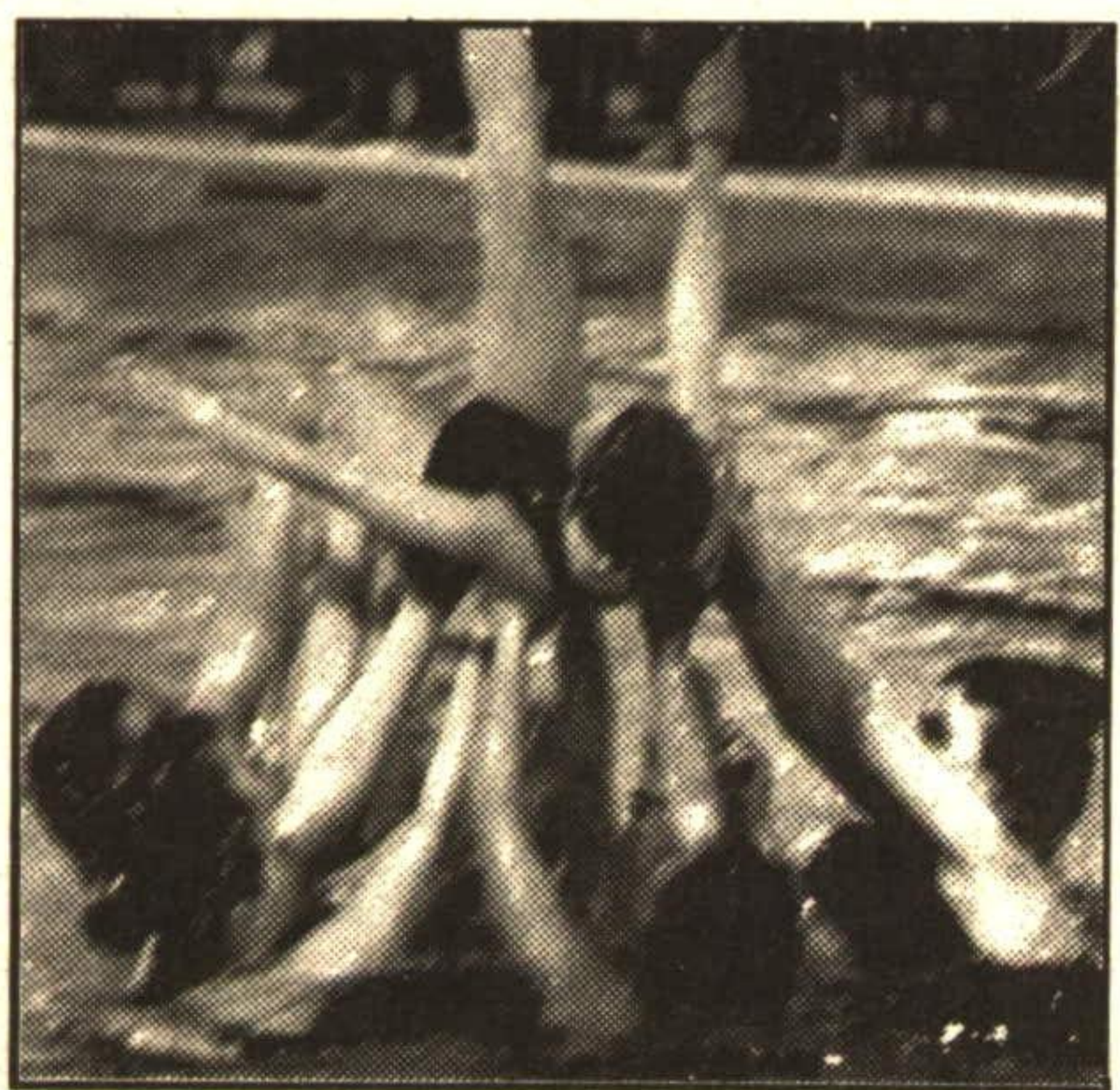
