Gardiner named in conflict complaint

Acton/Esquesing trustee Ethel Gardiner may have to go to court to defend her decision to vote on the Halton Board of Education's 1996 budget.

Gardiner and four other trustees were named in a conflict of interest complaint filed by the Taxpayers Coalition Burlington (TCB). Gardiner, however, did not feel it was appropriate to comment on the TCB action at this time. In fact as of Thursday, Gardiner had received no formal notification of the complaint, and became aware of it only through a newspaper article.

"I really believe that the people I represent know why I am there as a trustee," Gardiner told this newspaper. "And that gives me a great deal of satisfaction."

The crux of the TCB action is their belief that Municipal Conflict of Interest Act regulations may have been breached by the trustees, who have relatives working for the board, yet proceeded to take part in voting on the 1996-97

board budget. The quintet of trustees named in the document are Gardiner, Joe Pavelka and chair Linda Glover of Burlington, vice-chair Penny Siebert of Oakville, and Flo Belford of Milton.






Bob Williams, Halton director of education, said, when asked if the board would become involved in the details or the cost of legal representation for those named in the suit, "It would be expected individual trustees defend themselves."

Frank Gue, education chair of TCB Inc., said the organization had hoped to avoid court action and therefore had sent out registered letters to the five trustees May 17. The letter gave trustees a one-week deadline to tender their resignation. Gue said his group did not receive one reply.

He said documents were filed in Ontario court in Milton, June 3, and a hearing date of June 26
