Giants prove too tough

Double win for Georgetown 3-on-3 squad

The Georgetown Giants are two for two at three-on-three.

Actually, the Giants are three for two, after they earned a pair of titles at last week's Three-on-Three Street Hockey Challenge tournament at Alcott Arena.

The Giants dominated the 12-13 year-old division winning both the street hockey and roller hockey events.

That gave the Giants - Kevin Binsell, Nick Black, Ryan Busby, Kyle Hotham and Ryan LaRose - their third victory in under a month. The Giants had already qualified for the Ontario finals at the Canadian National Exhibition by winning a tournament in Kitchener on May 12. At that tournament they went undefeated and edged another local squad, the Georgetown Sharp, 4-2 in the final.

The Giants were just one of a number of local teams to come up victorious. Other winners included AAA Bruins (14-15 A), Orangeville's Flyers (14-15 B), Brampton Thunder (14-15 Roller), Rapid Fire (16-17 A), Burlington's Brad Marsh's Allstars (16-17 B), XPY Jr. (Adult B), and the Islanders (Adult Cash).

At 107 teams, registration was down from last year's record number of 130 teams. Tournament organizer Brian Snow was still pleased with the event.

"It was a little lower but it's still as many (teams) as most tournaments. We had a good turnout for kids teams," he said. "We're happy with the Georgetown tournament and happy that the Halton Hills area really supports all our events."

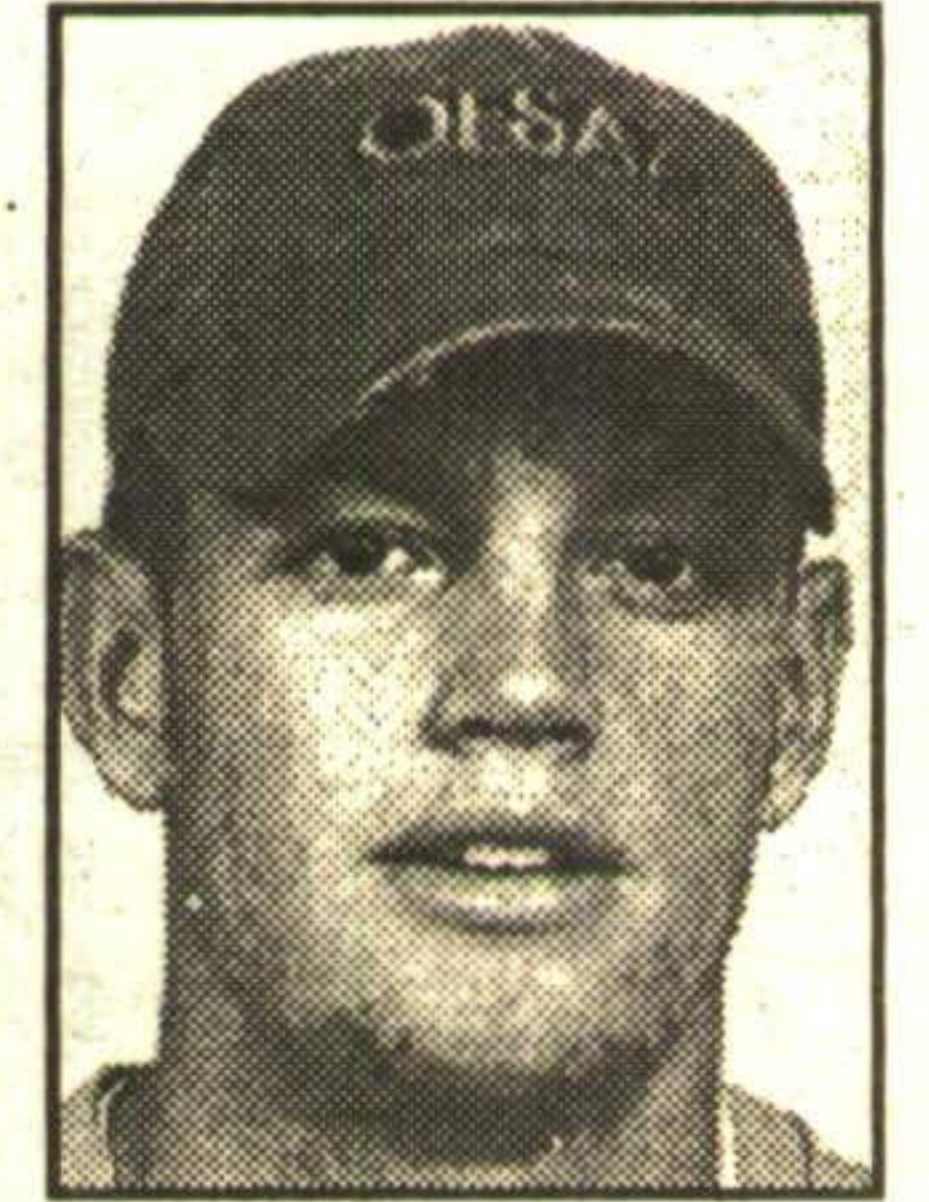
