The Georgetown Bulldogs continued their dominance over the Junior B's East Division Tuesday night in Scarborough, with a 12-3 pounding to the Saints.

Anchored by another stellar performance from star netminder Cory Fearon, the 'Dogs' shutout Scarborough through the last 48 minutes of play to turn an early 2-0 deficit into a nine-goal blowout.

The win improved their record to 11-5 - representing a tie for most season wins in franchise history - and has them at 6-0
