Four goals in the first 15 minutes put the game out of reach. Two uncharacteristic slips by the goalkeeper led to the opening goals and it was 6-0 by half-time. The second half proved that the local team, made up of players from all around Halton, does not give up and the girls took the game to the Scorpions on a more even track. A well-known local newspaperman, acting as a photographer, was taken aback at the physical ferocity of the tackling and observed that these were not demure young ladies out there. The girls next game is also a hard match-up - hosting top side Burlington.
