

Police beat

Fence trample

Halton Regional Police were called to investigate after a small herd of cows "trampled a fence and ran loose" on 22 Sideroad near Eighth Line.

Between July 30 and August 2, the herd escaped from a farm north of Georgetown. Police were notified after the animals destroyed the fence at a neighbor's farm.

Electronic equipment stolen

The investigation continues after someone entered a pair of rural Halton Hills homes and

stole electronic and camera equipment.

According to police at 11 Division, the houses are both located on Highway 7 near Sixth Line. One of the houses was entered sometime over the weekend after a sliding basement window was opened. Once inside, the culprit removed a VCR, Canon EOS camera kit and movies from the living

room and the master bedroom.

The second house was entered through an insecure garage window. The suspects then went through the living room and bedrooms and removed a JVC VCR, JVC camcorder and Motorola 7000 cellular telephone.

Property from the two houses was worth an estimated at \$5,500.

Unlocked garage

Police believe an unlocked garage allowed culprits to gain access to a Tenth Line residence sometime last Thursday or Friday.

Halton Regional Police at 11 Division say that once the culprit was inside the garage a pry bar was used to open a door leading to an adjoining laundry room.

The culprit then emptied a laundry basket and went through the living room, master bedroom and "baby's room" removing various jewelry and electronic equipment.

Among the items taken were 25 compact discs, 10 gold charms worth an estimated \$800 — and 2 gold wafers — worth \$200.


