Longhorns close in on GFFL title

The champagne is on ice and it appears only monumental upsets will deny former league champion Longhorns bragging rights to the 1992 regular-season title in the Georgetown Men's Flag Football League.

The league returns to action Sunday at Neilson's field, with three games scheduled. But with only two remaining in the 1992 regular-season schedule, Longhorns appear to have a lock on top spot.

Longhorns hold a four-point lead over both second-place Dawgs and Meznic Electric.

By virtue of an ironic scheduling twist of fate, the Longhorns will face both these teams in their final two outings of the 1992 regular-season campaign.

The league-leading Longhorns — sporting an unblemished 9-0 record — have already defeated the Dawgs and Meznic Electric this season and under the league's complicated system of breaking ties in the stands at the end of the regular season, both the challengers would have to post lopsided victories over the Longhorns to deny the green-and-white squad its well-earned day in the sun — or rain, as had been the case for most of the summer.

This is not to suggest that the string will be merely played out over the balance of the regular season. Most definitely, it will not be.

The regular-season scoring championship is up for grabs, with three players having legitimate shots at

the crown. The interception title is also clouded, with six players challenging for the honor.

Deliciously appropriate, the main contenders for the two titles will have a chance to prove their worth on the field, rather than in the statisticians office.

Gary Lockwood of Meznic Electric, leads the scoring parade with 78 points, just two ahead of Dawgs Dave Clements and just four ahead of Bob Davey of the Longhorns.

Jim Lindsay of the Longhorns leads Lockwood by one in the battle for the interception title while four players, including Clements, will usurp the crown by outstanding defensive efforts in their team's respective final two games.

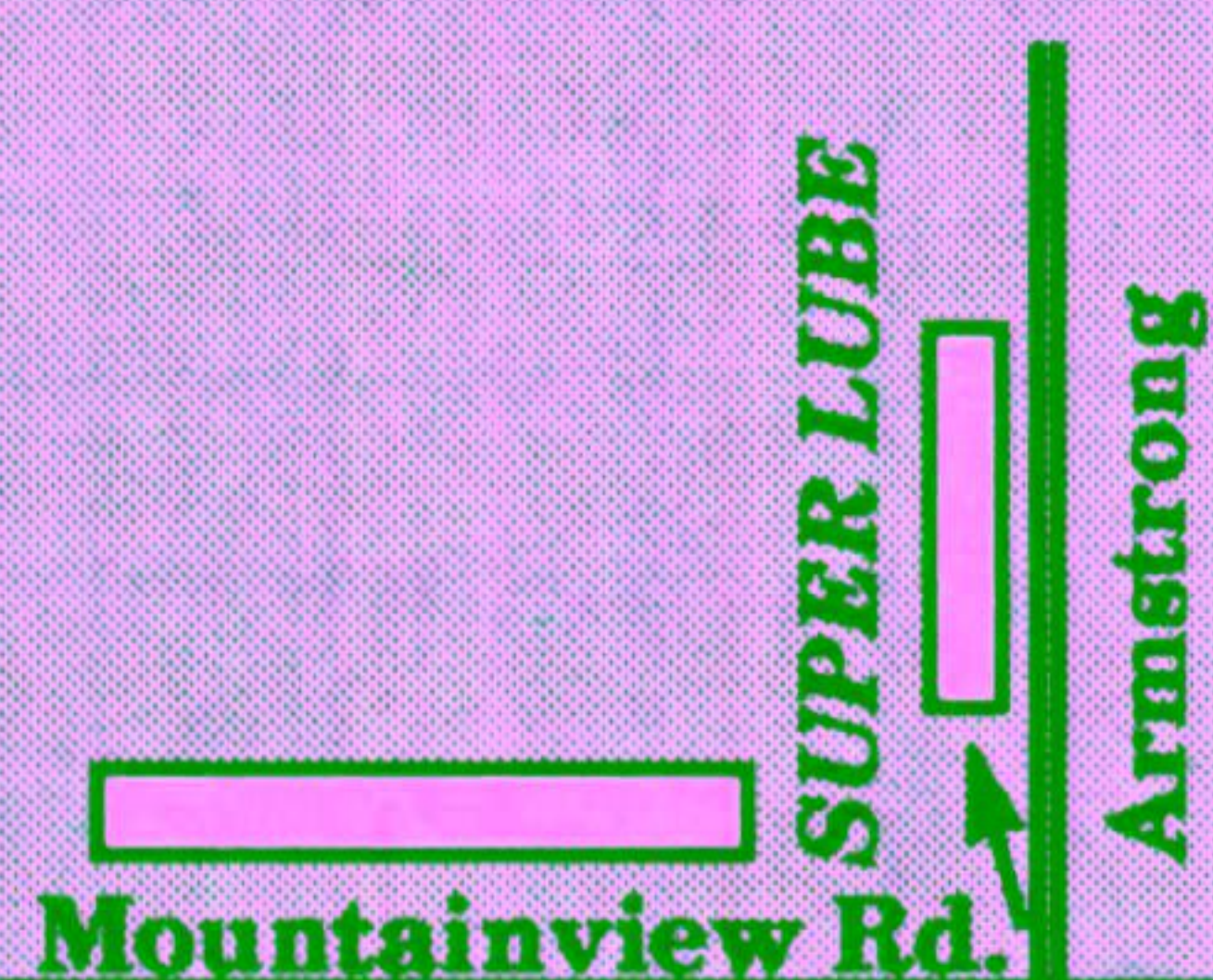

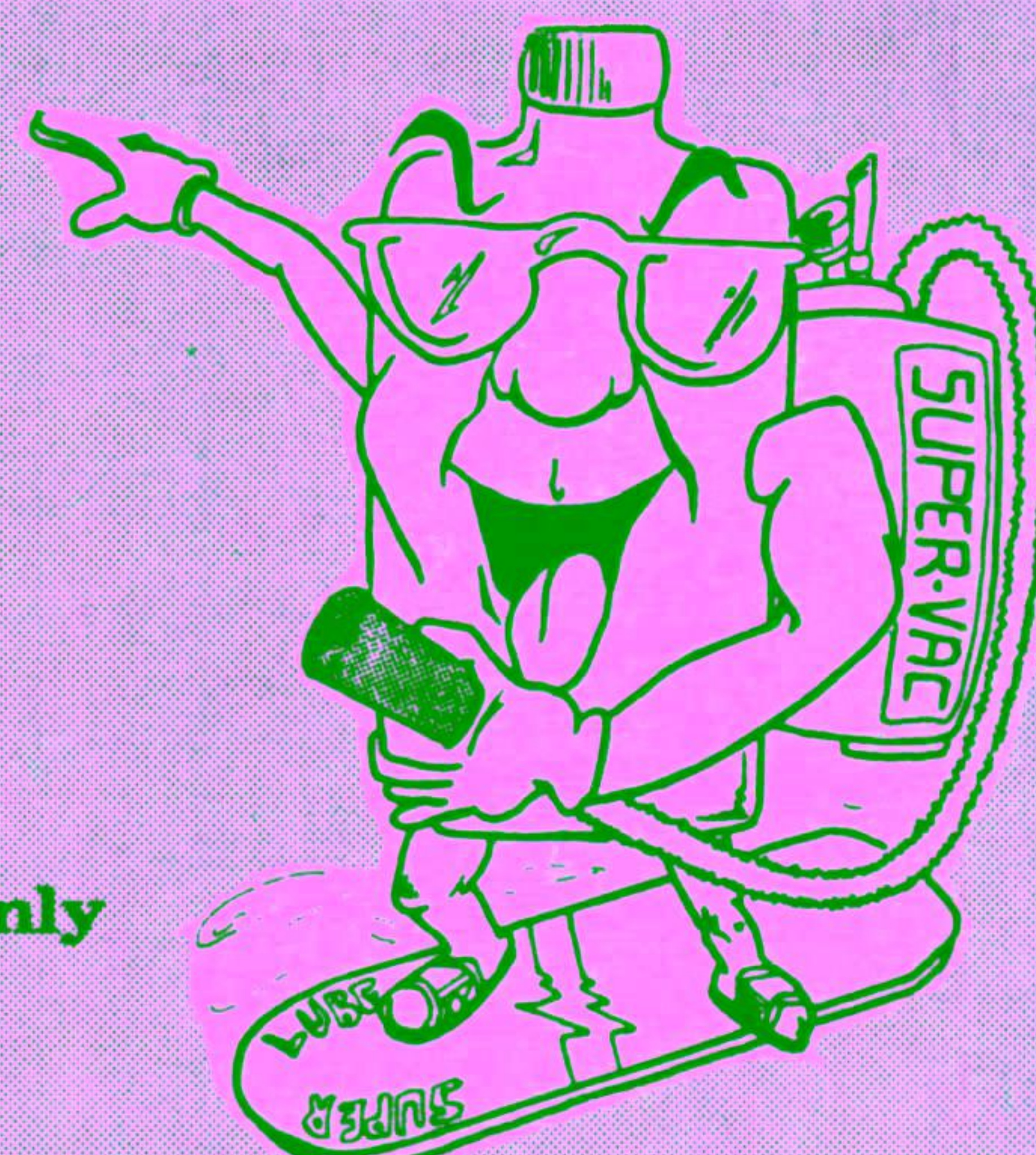
