Continued from page 1 mended that the proposed Regional Colley's recent report to to

future development of the property considering the fact that a water connection could make the property more attractive for further future development."

As a result, the town has recom-

mended that the proposed Regional OP amendment "specifically clarify" the land use role for the Croatian Centre on the property.

Council approved planning staff's recommendation three weeks ago, but because of Rennie's misgivings, the resolution was reconsidered last week. It was decided to defer the matter for four weeks until planning staff can obtain more information about the water connection.

The Croatian Social and Cultural Centre, located at the northwest intersection of No. 5 Sideroad and the Peel-Halton Hills Town Line, was originally used as a farm. Over the years, it evolved into a recreational and religious centre, which has been used by as many as 5,000 people daily on peak weekends.

Uses of the property are classified as legal non-conforming, in that they existed before a zoning bylaw was enacted for the property. Existing recreational uses on the site include a 5,349-square-foot multi-purpose building, a storage shed for food, a barbecue pit, grandstand, volleyball court, basketball court, swimming pool and washrooms and four soccer pitches. About 95 acres of the site is farmed.

Colley's recent report to town council indicates that relations between the Town and the Croatian Centre haven't run smoothly.

"In recent years, the Croatian Social and Cultural Centre have constructed structures on their property without the benefit of required Town approvals," the report said..

The water pipeline was constructed because the water supply from wells on the property was deemed inadequate and unsafe for human consumption.

In 1988, the Region of Peel agreed to provide municipal water to the facility "subject to Halton's concurrence on the necessary agreements."

Approval was given for a temporary water connection until the amendment to Halton's OP gets the go-ahead.

At last week's meeting of Halton Region's planning and public works committee, an information report prepared by the Region's planning commissioner Rash Mohammed indicated a number of "outstanding matters" need resolution before staff can report back on the Regional OP amendment.






