CPGA Seniors play final round today

Defending champion Adrien Bigras of Lachute, Quebec heads a strong field set to compete in the Transamerica CPGA Seniors' Championship to be held at the Blue Springs Golf Club in Acton, Ontario this weekend.

Bigras, who also captured the crown in Trois Rivieres, Quebec in 1989 will face several new challengers this year. Leading the group who just turned 50 is two-time CPGA champ Bob Panasik of Tecumseh, Ontario. Panasik has been a regular on the Canadian tour until this year when injuries and Senior events curtailed his play on the junior tour.

Also entered are four-time CPGA champ and PGA Tour winner Al Balding of Mississauga, 1990 Transamerica CPGA Senior winner Bob Rose of Hamilton, Bob Breen of Brampton who tied for third in this year's CPGA Club Pro Championship, and former CPGA victor Wilf Homeniuk of Toronto.

The field of the 68 senior professionals (50 years of age and older) began the competition with a Pro-Am on August 25, and the 54 hole championship running Thursday through Saturday.

The public is invited to attend the final round today. tentative tee-off times are from 7:30 a.m. to 11:30

a.m. at the Blue Springs Golf Club — Turtle Lake course.

The total prize money purse for the Transamerica Life sponsored event is \$20,000 and the winner's share is \$4,000. In addition, the winner will be awarded an all expense paid trip for two and given an exemption into the qualifying round of the Transamerica Senior Golf Championship. This tournament is part of the Senior PGA tour which is played at the Silverado Country Club and Resort, Napa Valley, California from October 14-18. This event is televised nationally and has total prize money of \$500,000.

Longhorns complete undefeated season

Meznic Electric squeezed into second place, while Longhorns completed an undefeated season, as regular season play in the Georgetown Mens' Flag Football League wrapped up last Sunday on a steamy Nelsons Field.

Lindsay won the title with six, but didn't get a steal Sunday. Lockwood, with five heading into Sunday, was similarly blanked while Mike DelGuidice of Dawgs got a theft to end up tied with Lockwood.

Meznic Electric came into this

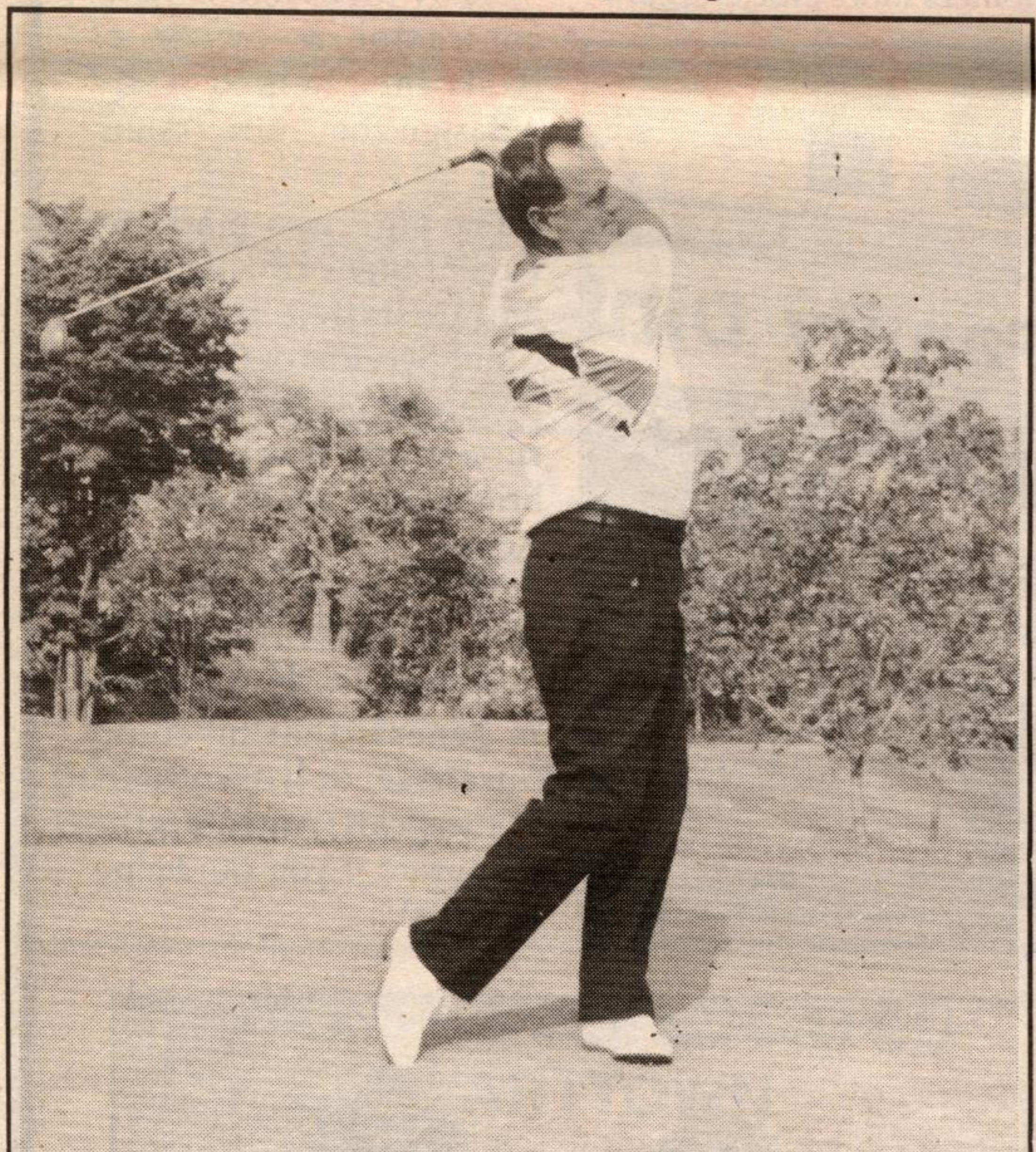
game knowing they would have to rack up the points while holding the opposition to as few as possible in order to finish the regular season in second place and gain the first round playoff bye.

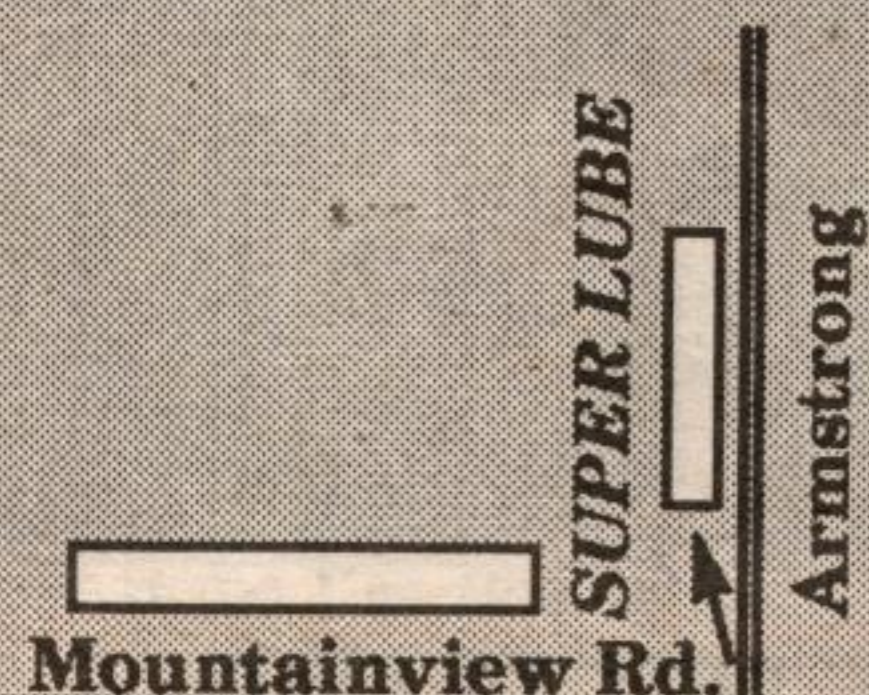
