**Elliott: action 'drastic and necessary'**

**Councillor Heaton dropped  
from Acton Arena committee**

The Acton Arena Steering Committee has voted in favor of having Ward 2 councillor Rob Heaton removed from the committee.

At its May 27 meeting of the interview sub committee, at which Heaton wasn't present, the committee unanimously passed a recommendation to have the mayor replace Heaton with another Ward 2 councillor.

Monday Councillor Norm Elliott, who chairs the steering committee, called the action "drastic and necessary." He added the committee is very upset at Heaton's "lack of commitment to the process."

The recommendation spelled out four reasons for taking the action.

First, "Heaton transmitted minutes of the Arena Steering Committee to the press" before they had been approved by the committee.

Second, Heaton "declined to submit evaluations of the architects interviewed" to do the design of the Acton Arena "in keeping with the process agreed upon by the committee," threatening to skew the results of the

evaluations.

Third, Heaton refused to return privileged and confidential architectural documents on request, placing the committee in a potentially serious litigation situation.

Fourth, it appears Heaton "does not wish to work cooperatively with the committee for the successful completion of the arena project, and jeopardizes by his obstructive behavior, the project."

"The last thing we want is to create unnecessary delays (with the arena project). We don't need ridiculous, juvenile theatrics to be part of the process," said Elliott.

"This document (the minutes of the meeting) to my understanding is not a public document until next week's (council) meeting when the previous meeting's minutes are ratified," said Heaton when asked to comment on the issue Monday. He added he wouldn't comment without legal advice.

Town clerk Janet Lunn Stewart said Monday the minutes of the meeting were released properly and that the minutes had been adopted as confidential minutes at the June 10 council meeting.

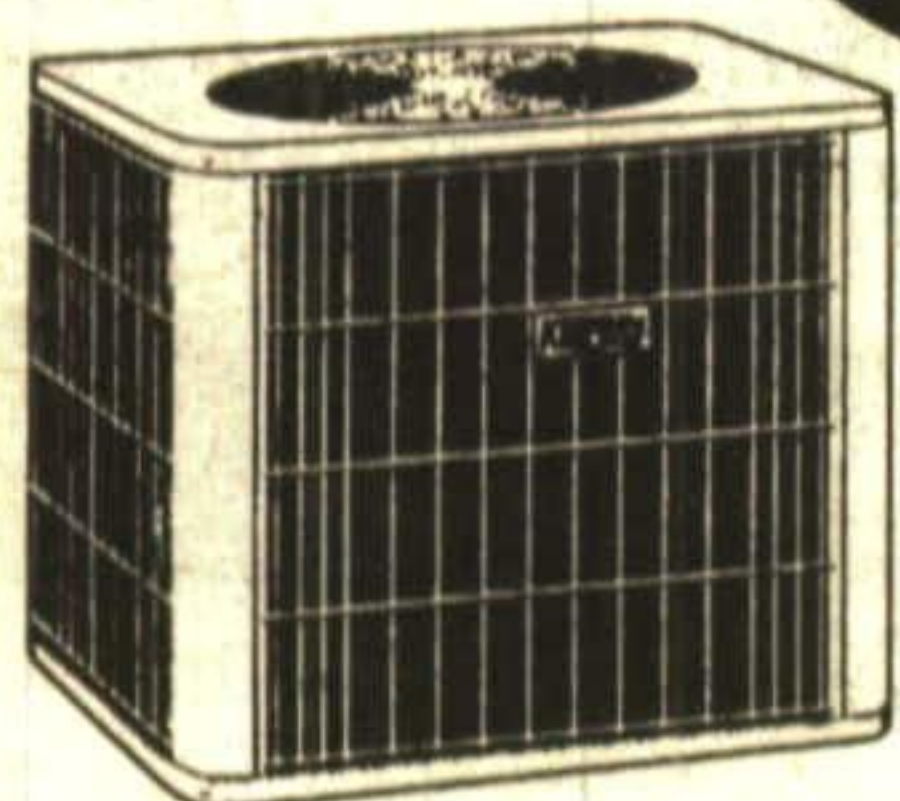
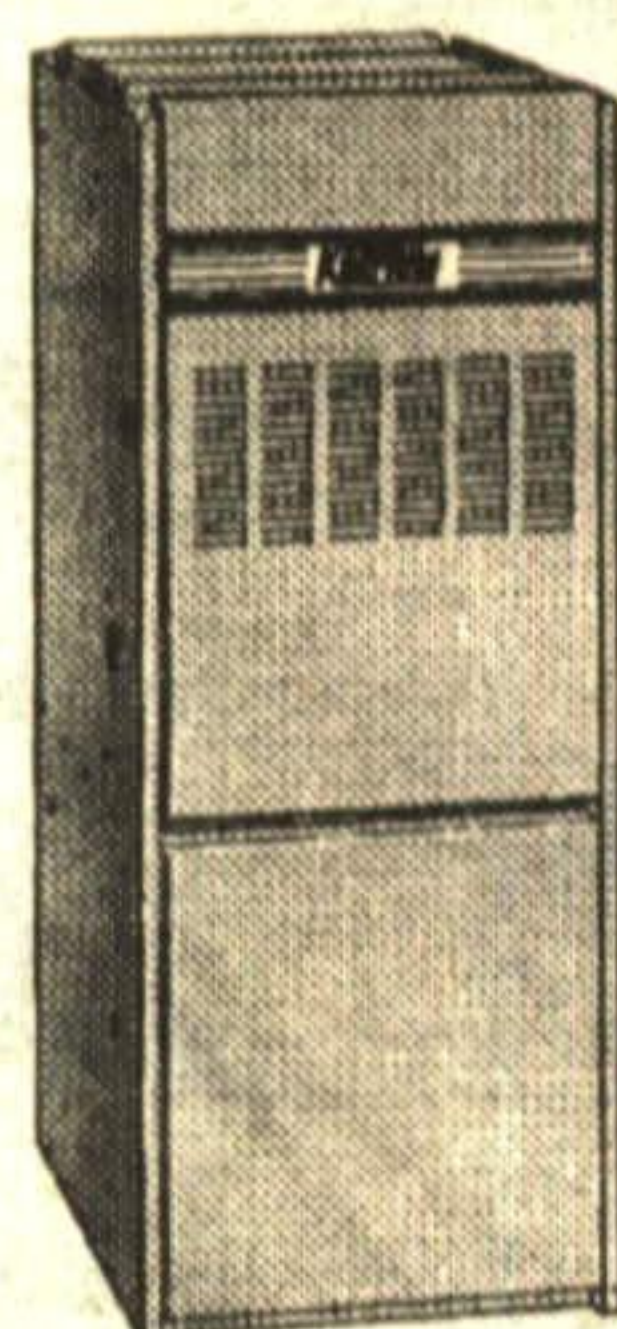
**Stolen cars**

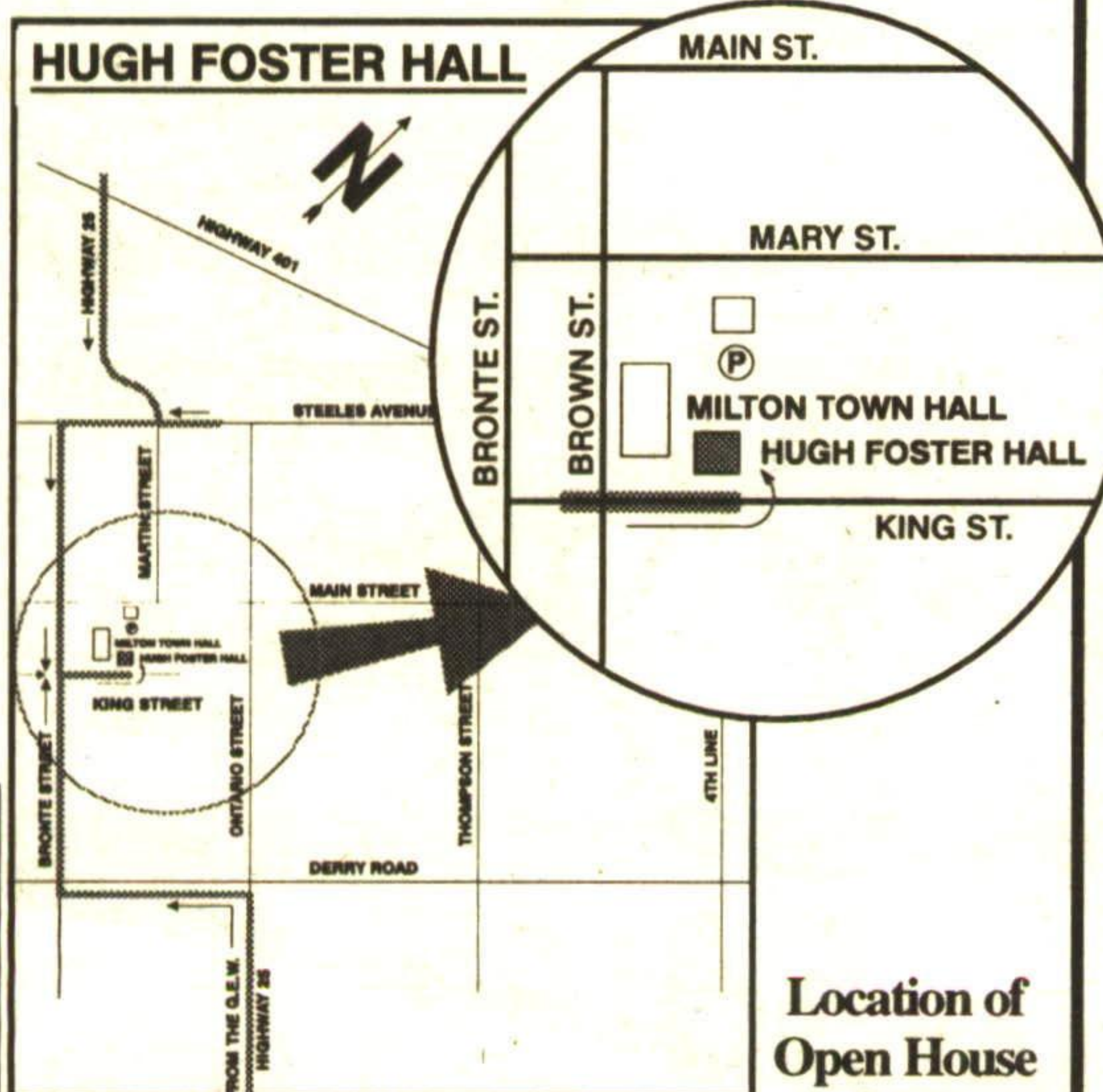

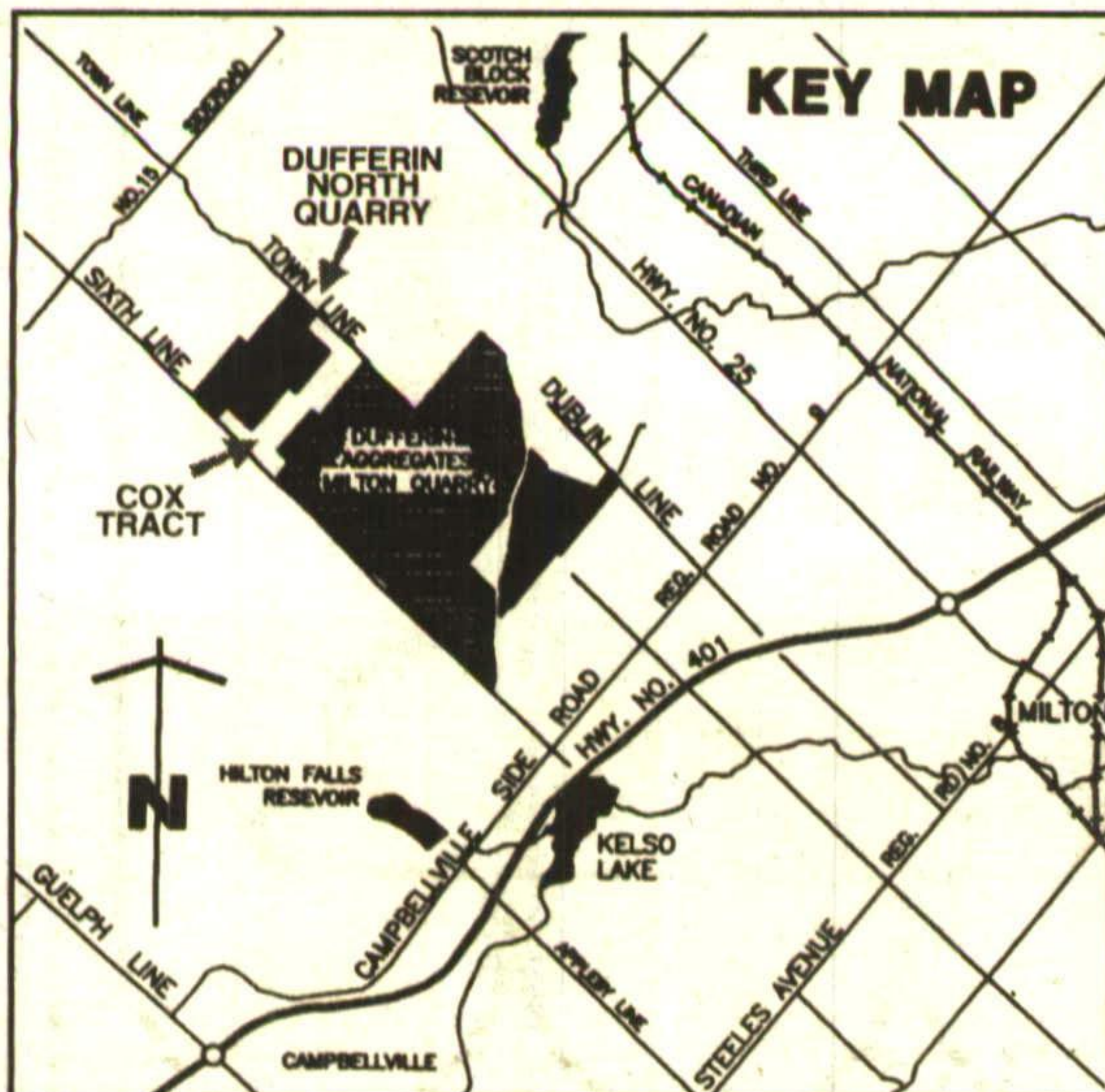
