

Kleinburg artist designs new logo

for Halton Hills

A Kleinburg graphic artist has come up with the winning design for the town's new logo.

The logo designed by Vida Skilandziunas, a graphic arts coordinator for the City of Vaughan, was selected as the winner from the 166 entries in the town's logo design competition.

Monday, the m a y o r presented the artist with a t-s h i r t e m b l a z o n e d with the green and blue logo and a cheque for \$1,000, donated by area businesses.

Skilandziunas's design features four pillars which form the two Hs in Halton Hills. She said the inclusion of the pillars in the logo, which are part of the Civic Centre entrance way and council chambers, was coincidental.

She said while she didn't visit Halton Hills before she designed the logo, she attempted to capture the feeling of the town portrayed in the stock is designed be used letterhead business uniforms, brochures, brochures, promotional

According to the logo description the pillars represent "a strong community made up of a number of elements." The pillars also represent the town's urban communities, hamlets, rural areas and strength.

The description says the winding shape that flows across the pillars "represents the natural and human aspects of the town." The shape




also represents the two rivers which flow through Halton Hills, Credit River and Sixteen Mile Creek, the hills in town and the way the Niagara Escarpment traverses the town.

The logo, which will be phased in after old stock is depleted, could be used on town letterhead, trucks, business cards, uniforms, ads, brochures, signs and promotional items.
