Pupils must get 'shots' before school starts

When students return to school next week, they will be required by law to have had a second dose of measles vaccine.

The law—the Immunization of School Pupils Act—makes parents and guardians responsible for ensuring children are adequately immunized against diphtheria, tetanus, polio, measles, mumps and rubella (German measles).

A recent amendment to the act makes it mandatory for students to be immunized with two doses of measles vaccine.

To be valid, the first dose of measles vaccine must have been given after the first birthday and the second dose at least one month later.

95 % already up-to-date

Following last spring's mass immunization campaign against measles, approximately 95 per cent of Halton's students are up-to-date with this latest immunization requirement. Others may be exempt from the immunization for medical reasons or for religious or conscientious beliefs.

Students still requiring a second dose of measles vaccine, who are not exempt, are invited to take advantage of the Halton Regional Health Department's final catch-up measles immunization clinic. The clinic is scheduled for Sept. 26, 2 p.m. to 7 p.m. in the auditorium at Halton Regional Centre, 1151 Bronte Road, Oakville. The entrance to the auditorium is by the north driveway. No appointments are necessary.

Parents of children entering the classroom for the first time need to ensure their children are up to date with diphtheria, tetanus, polio, mumps and rubella (German measles) immunization as well as the second dose of measles vaccine. Immunization for these junior and senior kindergarten children is through family doctors.

Cost: No cost to you if you qualify for sponsored training; eligibility determined by Human Resources Development Canada.

Eligibility Requirements: A Canadian Citizen or permanent resident; 17 years of age, and out of the regular school system for at least 12 consecutive months since turning 16 years of age; unemployed, currently receiving Employment Insurance (formerly UI benefits or those who received UI benefits within the last three years; five years in the case of maternity or parental leave.)
