I'm sorry, but they're all fanatics, out of control, paying large sums of money to Mr. McGhie, for the honor of losing every week.


It baffles me. Why anyone would want to waste their hard-earned money on such a folly.

Not me. You won't see me wasting my money on John's NFL pool. It's just not responsible.


Besides, if I did, where would I get the money for my occasional 6/49 tickets?


