Times a changin' thanks to children's chorus

If you turn on your television or radio these days, chances are good you'll catch some local talent featured prominently in Bank of Montreal commercials.

the choir from various age groups were cast in the commercial.

They joined about 300 school kids on a farm in the Collingwood area where the

commercial was shot over two days in September.

Nine-year-old Corey Carlton was one of the area kids who participated.

"It was really exciting. I had

lots of fun," said Carlton.

"I think it is amazing to be on television across Canada for four months," said Nora Loreto, another choir member who appeared in the commercial. She added her friends are envious of her sudden fame.

Fraser said the casting people were so impressed with the choir members' performance at the shoot she was asked to bring about 30 members to a Toronto recording studio to sing the Dylan song.

"It was really neat to see how actual people are recorded," said Loreto.

Carlton said the recording process was not what he expected and he was surprised that they all wore headphones.

The choir members performed seveal takes of the song and they are the only voices that can be heard, except for the lead vocalist, on the commercial.

Fraser said the experience for the kids was "wonderful" and added the choir also received a substantial contribution from the company for its trip to Holland in 1998.






