



Mark Kalous exhibit opens at the Gallery tomorrow

If you love nature and art, don't miss the Mark Kalous exhibit at Halton Hills Cultural Centre Gallery, Oct. 21 to Nov. 4.

The Acton artist combines his two loves— painting and nature together with breathtaking results.

Specializing in oil and acrylics, he trained his

artist's eye on portraits, landscapes, Mennonite scenes and most recently, Mother Nature's creatures. One of his best selling prints, Catnapping—But Alert, is a realistic portrait of a Canadian lynx. Critics have compared its style and skill favorably with renowned artist Robert Bateman.

Kalous was born in Czechoslovakia, but arrived in Canada as a refugee in 1950. The Iron Curtain kept him separate from his wife, but in 1965 they were reunited, and they settled just outside of Acton. Three years later their son joined them in their new home.

laid off from his tool and die maker job and decided then to turn his attention full time to his art. His paintings now hang in many private collections around the world, as well as a few art galleries.

His first show at the Cultural Centre in 1989 received favorable reviews and they have grown with each annual show.

This year, his fifth anniversary at the Gallery, the offical opening and reception will be held on Oct. 22, 6-9 p.m. Coffee and tea will be served with cookies and homemade pastries.

Kalous will also be in the Gallery every day of his exhibition and sale, from 2 p.m. until the library closes.

RELINING DENTURES
QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q: What is a permanent processed reline?

A: A processed reline is a way of re-basing your denture with the same type of long cure acrylic from which it was originally made. This will make the denture fit more snugly to your ridge.

Q: Will it change the appearance of my teeth?

A: No, it only re-fits the denture to your ridge, no

change of tooth position takes place.

Q: What are soft, or cushion, relines?

A: A permanent soft-rubber lining is applied to the lower denture inside ridge. Soft, or cushion, relines are an excellent alternative for those who have sensitive oral tissue and tend to get frequent sore spots. A properly applied soft lining can provide years of comfortable chewing and smiling!

Q: How long will it take?

A: Most relines commenced in the morning are completed and returned to the patient that after-

Q: What is I'm a working person and can't give up my teeth for a day?

A: The alternative is to bring your dentures in after work. It can be relined and returned to you the next morning by 8:30 a.m.

Relining an existing denture is an excellent economical way to prolong the life of your plate by restoring and maintaining a firm comfortable fit.


