# Future of fire hall put on hold

Halton Hills councillors have deferred dealing with a staff report on the disposal of the old Acton Fire Hall, until Heritage Acton has been informed.

At last Monday's general committee meeting, councillors were reluctant to accept a report which recommended that Heritage Acton's request to take over the building be deferred and that instead the building be put on the market for about six months.

The old hall located at 32 Bower St. has been declared surplus by the

town and property valuation suggested a listing price of \$160,000. The staff report indicated that the Acton Support Services and Information Centre (ASSIC) and the Acton Old Town Hall Theatre, a non-profit group which would like to bring live theatre here, have both requested that the building be conveyed to them.

Earlier this month, Heritage Acton proposed that if the town conveyed them the property the group would restore it into a

community centre.


