Negotiations to continue Halton-Peel water deal possible?

Halton regional staff have been given the go-ahead to continue negotiating with Peel for the use of their eastern neighbor's water and wastewater service.

The green light came recently at a joint meeting of Halton's planning and public works and administration and finance committees. It follows an agreement by Peel Region to supply Halton with enough water to service 5,000 new houses and about 200 hectares of commercial and industrial land for future development.

While regional councillors are encouraged by a possible link with Peel, they haven't completely abandoned the idea of letting a private sector partner build and operate the infrastructure needed under the Halton Urban Structure Plan.

Prior to Peel's commitment to supply services, Halton had solicited private sector proposals to deal with its water dilemma. A total of seven

were received with three; Halton Water Partnership, Consumer's Utilities and Canadian Clean Water Systems, short listed.

Although request for these proposals has been held off, they may still be forthcoming should negotiations with Peel fall through.

Regional councillors approved \$270,000 in funding to be used for studies and legal fees in negotiations.

Peel Region will be given \$50,000 of that to prepare a detailed proposal.

Regional councillors hope to have a conclusive staff report with recommended options by January.

An agreement with Peel would see a pipeline link the two regions, most likely running from north Peel to Milton. Milton would be the main beneficiary of water and wastewater service, but councillors said parts of Halton Hills and north Oakville could also be allocated a portion of the services.

Major benefits of integrating water and wastewater systems with Peel are the savings related to using Peel's existing infrastructure, and the potential sharing of new infrastructure to be built to service both north Halton and north Peel.
