

## New Georgetown food bank to open next Saturday

Bread Teorgetown Basket, Georgetown's new food bank, will open Saturday, November 16.

The food bank, located at 247 Armstrong Ave., Unit 9, will be distributing food to the needy from 10 a.m. to noon that day. The food bank will be open to the public Sunday, Nov. 17, 2-4 p.m. to give people a chance to see how a food bank operates.

Food bank co-ordinator

Colleen Brown, said the food bank's directors will be on hand at the open house along with the CEO of Toronto's Daily Bread Food Bank, Sue Cox.

Door prizes donated by local businesses will be given to the public to thank them for their support.

Brown isn't certain how many people will use the new food bank but said according to the Canadian Food Bank Association there has been a 40 to 60 per cent increase in food bank usage over the past year. When Love in Christ Food Bank closed in May, 225 families, or 550 people, were regular users of the bank. She is concerned those numbers could have increased dramatically.

Brown said the food bank will require identification from all the people who will be eating food from the bank, not just from those picking it up. She added users will also have to provide proof of their financial situation including canceled rent cheques, utility bills and unemployment insurance statements.


"Absolutely no one will be


turned down at their first visit however," she added.


Brown said non-perishable food and money are desperately needed but a refrigerator or freezer are no longer required as they have been donated. Brown said the food bank will have to spend about \$800 a month to stay open and has only enough to cover about four months in its bank account.
