At Halton Hills general committee on Nov. 4:

■ It was announced that a public information centre will be held Nov. 12 on the Dominion Gardens property master plan at the John Elliott Theatre.

■ Councillor Moya Johnson, budget chair, announced that town budget deliberations will begin this month. The public is welcome to all 6 p.m. meetings, at the Civic Centre. On Nov. 18, budget strategy will be discussed and on Nov. 19 and Nov. 26 (if necessary), the capital budget is the topic.

■ Councillor John Day advised council that in early December he will be bringing a report on a Downtown Georgetown survey.

■ Councillor Day will try to create better lines of communication with the introduction of a notice of motion at the Nov. 11 meeting, that better notification of council matters be given to the public and the press.

■ Councillor Day will introduce a notice of motion at the Nov. 11 meeting calling for an all-way stop sign at the intersection of Prince Charles Dr. and Brucewood Rd. He said that many drivers are using Prince Charles Dr. as a bypass to Guelph St.

■ Agreed to execute a site plan agreement with Polyplast Group, 42 Armstrong Ave., which wants to add a 300 square metre office addition and 2,508 sq. m. warehouse to their current facility.

Fact Finder appointed

The Ontario Education Relations Commission has appointed Daniel Gold to act as Fact Finder in the negotiations between the secondary teachers and the trustees of the Halton Roman Catholic School Board.

The secondary teachers have been without a contract since August 31.

Gold will meet with both parties and write a report, setting out which matters have been agreed upon and which matters remain in dispute. The report may also contain recommendations for settlement.

Joe Diuvaldo, president of the Halton unit of the Ontario English Catholic Teachers Association (OECTA), says both parties will have seven days to identify individual items of concern and where they sit on those issues. Diuvaldo refused comment on the specific issues.

After 45 days, he said "that information will be public information and the public's interest will be served."
