Rebels ousted from football playoffs

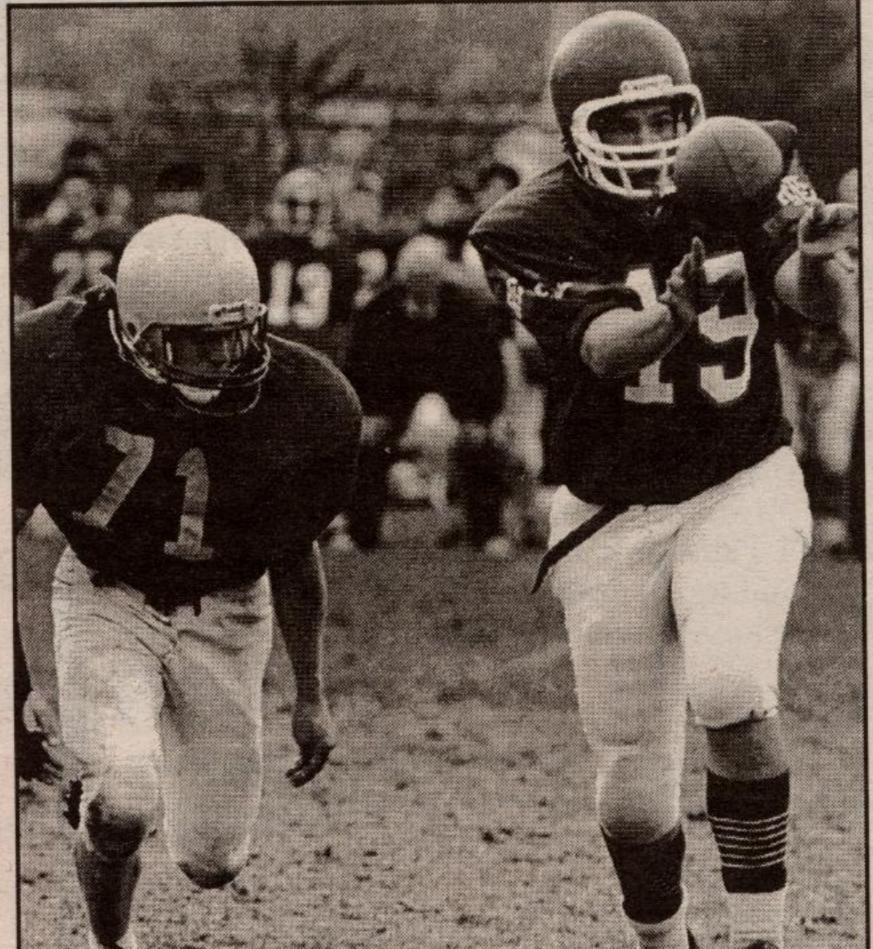
urlington Central took advantage of two miscues near the end of the first half as they eliminated the Georgetown District High School Rebels junior football team from the playoffs with a 40-11 win.

Onirik Sarma's field goal had the Rebels tied 3-3 in Wednesday's Halton Secondary School Athletic Association semifinal. However, Burlington Central, which was a perfect 7-0 heading into the game, pulled away in the last two minutes of the half by capitalizing on turnovers.

Burlington ran an interception back for a touchdown then, one play after the Rebels fumbled on their own 15, passed for another major. That put the Rebels down 17-3 heading into the half.

"The line played well and we were running the ball and then we had a lapse in the last two minutes," said Rebel coach Rick Redshaw. "They scored on our mistakes."

The Rebels closed the gap to six on a Sandy Chapman touchdown run and Curtis Gregson's twopoint convert in the second half. The comeback stalled when Burlington Central broke a couple long TD runs.

Fall to Iroquois Ridge

Perfect season ends for senior Rebels

> The first loss of the season for the Georgetown District High School Rebels senior volleyball L team proved to be the last.

After going a perfect 10-0 through the regular season and the first two rounds of the playoffs, the Rebels finally met their match in the Halton Secondary School Athletic Association semifinals. The Rebels were eliminated 15-13, 15-11 by Iroquois Ridge in front of a vocal home crowd Thursday.

Uncharacteristic errors by the Rebels allowed the Ridge to put together a long run in each game. In each case it put GDHS in a hole that proved to be too deep for the Rebels to climb out.

The opening game saw Iroquois Ridge clinging to a 6-5 lead when it took six of seven points to go ahead 12-6. The Rebels fought back to tie the game at 13-13 behind the blocking of Matt Johnson and the play of Matt Zarnke and Matt Jolliffe at the net. The Rebels lost their momentum after the Ridge called a time out. Two Rebel serves into the net gave Iroquois Ridge the opportunity to put the game away.

GDHS had an early 2-1 lead in the second game but the Ridge again took six of the next seven points to jump ahead 7-3. The Rebels never really recovered until Brad Spears led a Rebel charge while facing match point.

"Those two runs did us in and we did absolutely nothing to prevent them. (Iroquois Ridge) didn't even have to touch the ball," said Rebel coach Bob McKay. "You just can't come back against a good team from that far down."

Although the Rebels' pursuit of a Halton title escaped them, McKay said the team should be proud of what it accomplished.

"I'm very happy with these guys," McKay said. "We have no club players. We have a couple with club experience but right now it's just high school players. For them to come out and do this well is great."

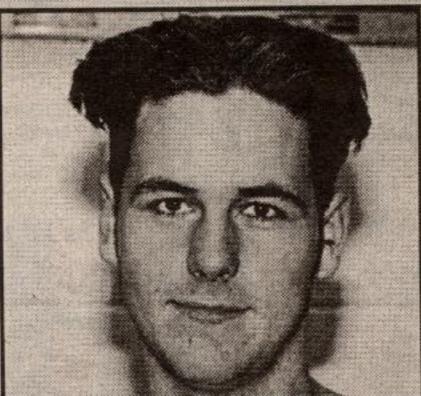

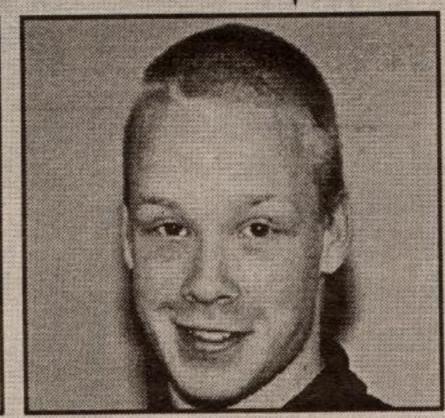

The Acton High School Athletes of the Week are Kristin Finlay and Mike DeBruyn.

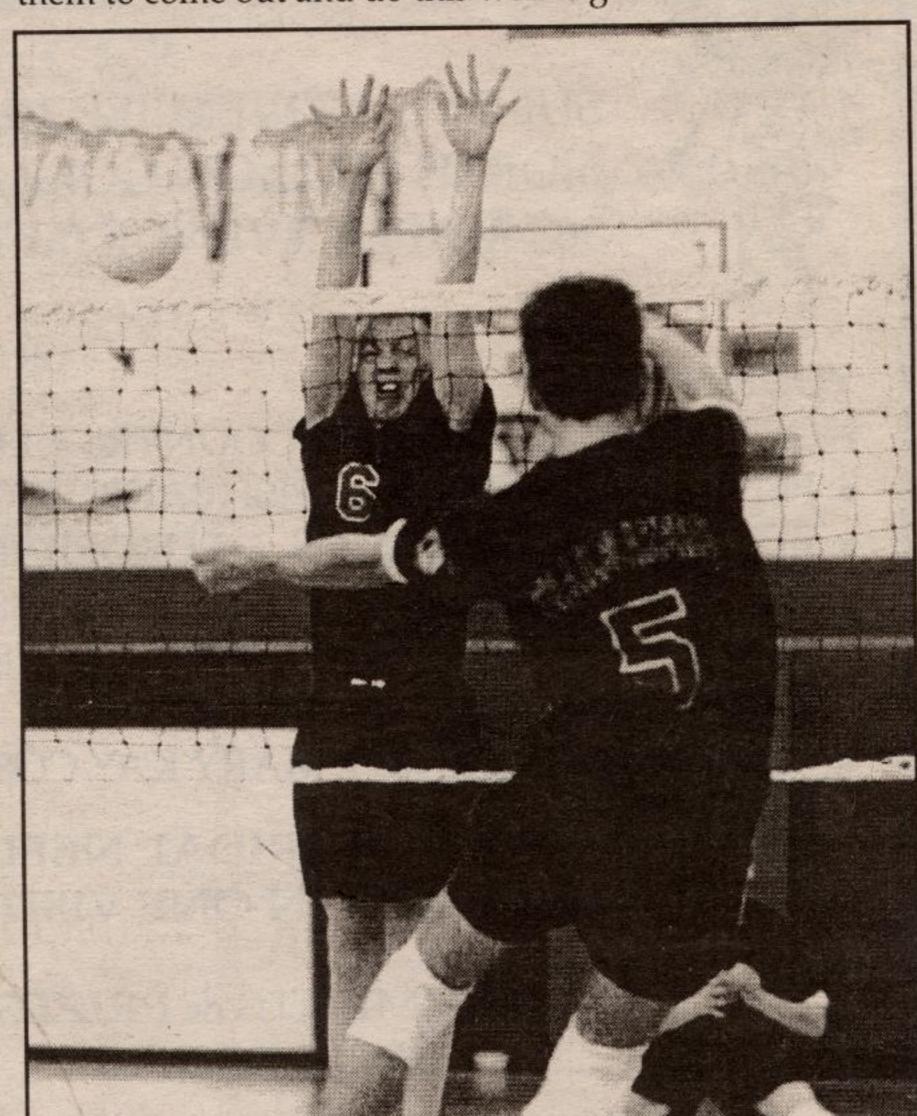
Finlay was chosen for being the top scorer on the junior Redmen basketball team, racking up 18 points in two games.
