The Halton Novice Hurricanes scored three unanswered goals as they defeated Brampton 4-1.



OHA grants request

Raiders unlikely to use affiliate this year

A lthough the Georgetown Raiders have been granted a late affiliation request by the OHA, it's unlikely the team will work out an agreement this season.

Raider coach and GM Rick Bince has been negotiating with a Jr. C team in hopes of striking an affiliation for the remainder of the season. However, there are a couple of roadblocks in his path. The first is trying to negotiate an affiliation in mid-season.

"What advantage is it to them (the affiliate) now?"
Bince said. "The advantage is always to the club at the higher level. All indications are it would be something we're looking to for next year."

The second barrier is finances. Bince had hoped to strike a deal with the Orangeville Crushers at the beginning of the year but the Jr. C team got a cash deal from the North Bay Centennials of the Ontario Hockey League.

"We don't have accessible money," Bince said. "What I have to do is try to convince a team that what we can't give you financially, I can give you with my recruiting abilities."

Bince said an affiliation would help the team in case of injuries or in situations like the beginning of the season when the team was short on defencemen. It would also give the Raiders the use of some Jr. C cards, giving them a little more flexibility with their roster.




