Town files OMB appeal against Peel

Talton Hills filed an appeal with the Ontario Municipal Board over the Region of Peel's Official Plan concerning Winston Churchill Blvd.

The town is arguing that a designation of road width is not compatible with Halton Hills' or

Halton region's.

According to a report prepared by Karen Pianosi, Halton Hills deputy planning director, the Peel Official Plan identifies Winston Churchill Blvd. as a "major road "and having a right of way of 36 metres between Hwy. 401 and the northern boundary of Halton Hills. However, Halton region which designated the road south of Hwy. 7 as "major arterial" states the right of way should only be 35 metres, and the "arterial designation of the road, north of Hwy. 7. requires only a 30 metre right of way. Halton Hills conforms to the region's widths.

Brampton intends to extend its urban boundary to Halton Hills boundary and is proposing an industrial district "Gateway West" to extend from Hwy. 7 to Hwy. 401. This could affect Halton Hills' ability to market its own Steeles Ave.-Hwy. 401 industrial corridor.

Halton Hills council has already written to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing requesting the modification of the Peel Official Plan. Both ministry and Peel staff did not respond to Halton Hills' request, according to Pianosi's report.

The town report also noted that the portion of Winston Churchill Blvd running through Norval is wholly within the boundary of Halton Hills and Halton region and should not be included in the Peel Official Plan.

This year the annual festivities include a host of special activities including an author's signing of the edited version of Lucy.


