




By Cory Soal R.H.A.D. THE MANY USES OF FM FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED

School districts are one of the largest customers of FM technology. In classrooms for the hearing impaired, the teacher wears a microphone/transmitter and the students may wear their own hearing instruments, as well as individual FM systems set to the teachers transmission channel.

For students with attention problems, a personal FM system reduces distracting background noises by transmitting an amplified version of the teacher's voice directly to the student's ear. This system is intended for one-to-one operation from teacher to student, or to several students within the same classroom. A clip on transmitter and a pocket-sized receiver makes this an extremely flexible system that allows for great mobility. This type of personal FM unit has also been adopted by many individuals for home and business use.




