Local gymnasts shine

Holly Johnson earned a silver medal finish in the all-round competition to lead the Halton Hills Gymnastic Club at the first Central Region gymnastics qualifying meet in Oakville.

"They all met and some even exceeded expectations for this meet," said head coach Paula Lockwood. "The girls were focused and confident and certainly inspired to work harder and they were excited to get back in the gym. We couldn't ask for more."

Johnson placed first in both bars and floor in the Level I nine-year-old division and also added a third in the beam and a fifth in vault.

Stephanie Palichuk was first in bars and second in floor.

In the Level I 10-year-old division Valerie Noblett brought home a bronze in bars, fourth in floor and was seventh in beam.

Erin Carter turned in a strong meet in the Level II 11-year-old division as she was consistent in all four events and placed fifth in beam.

In the Level I 11-year-old category Lisa Etchells performed well capturing a sixth in floor and eighth in vault.

Jenna Johnson pulled off a personal best in the Level I 12-13-year-old division with a bronze in bars, fourth in beam and eighth in vault for a sixth all-round finish. Lisa Butler, another rookie on the provincial squad, was second in vault, fourth in floor, sixth in bars and wound up eighth all-round.

The gymnasts will compete in two more qualifying meets, the next slated for Feb. 2-4 in Guelph. The best two finishes of the three meets are calculated to select the top six in each category to represent the Central Region at the provincial championships in the spring.

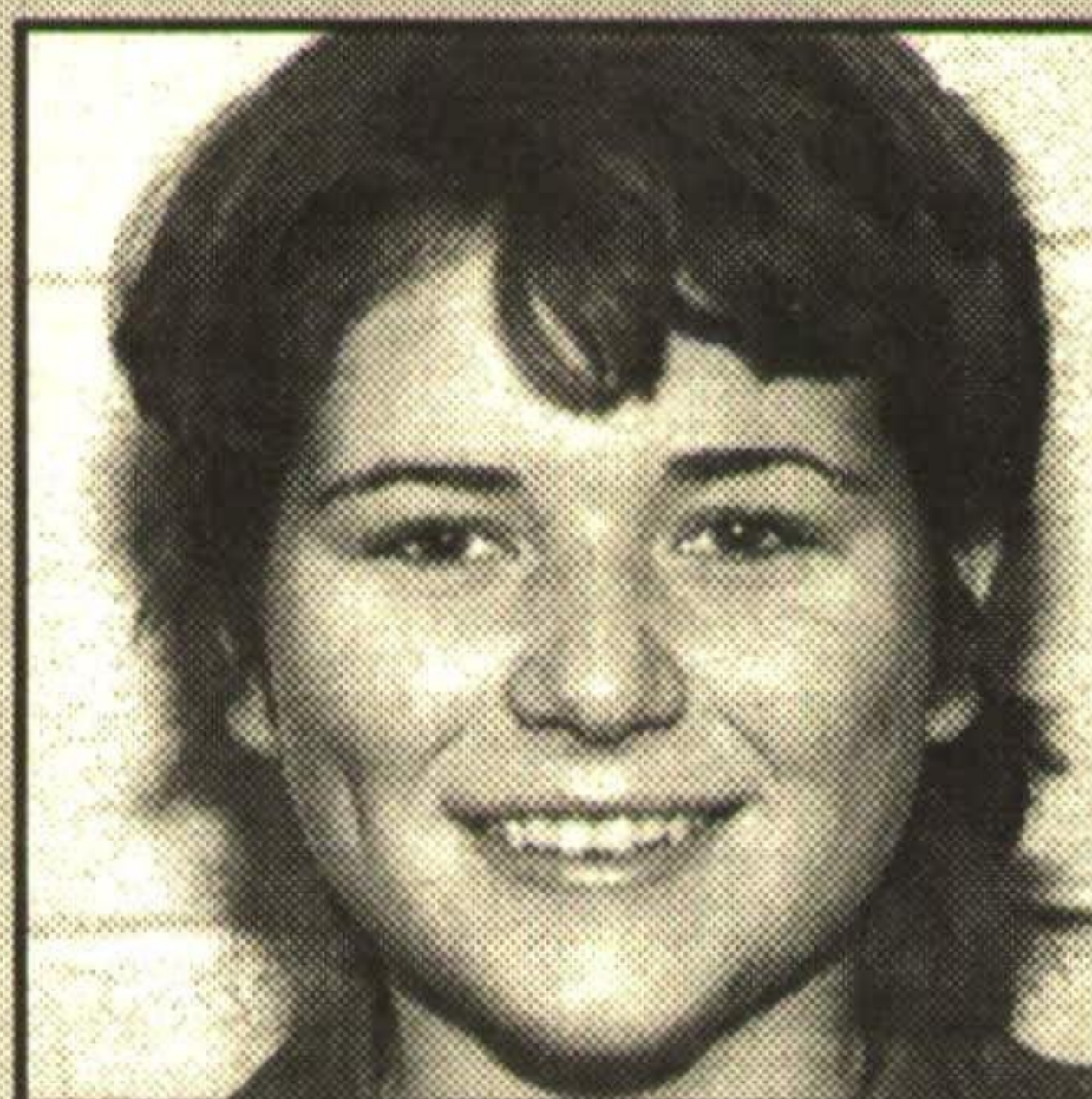

Athletes of the Week

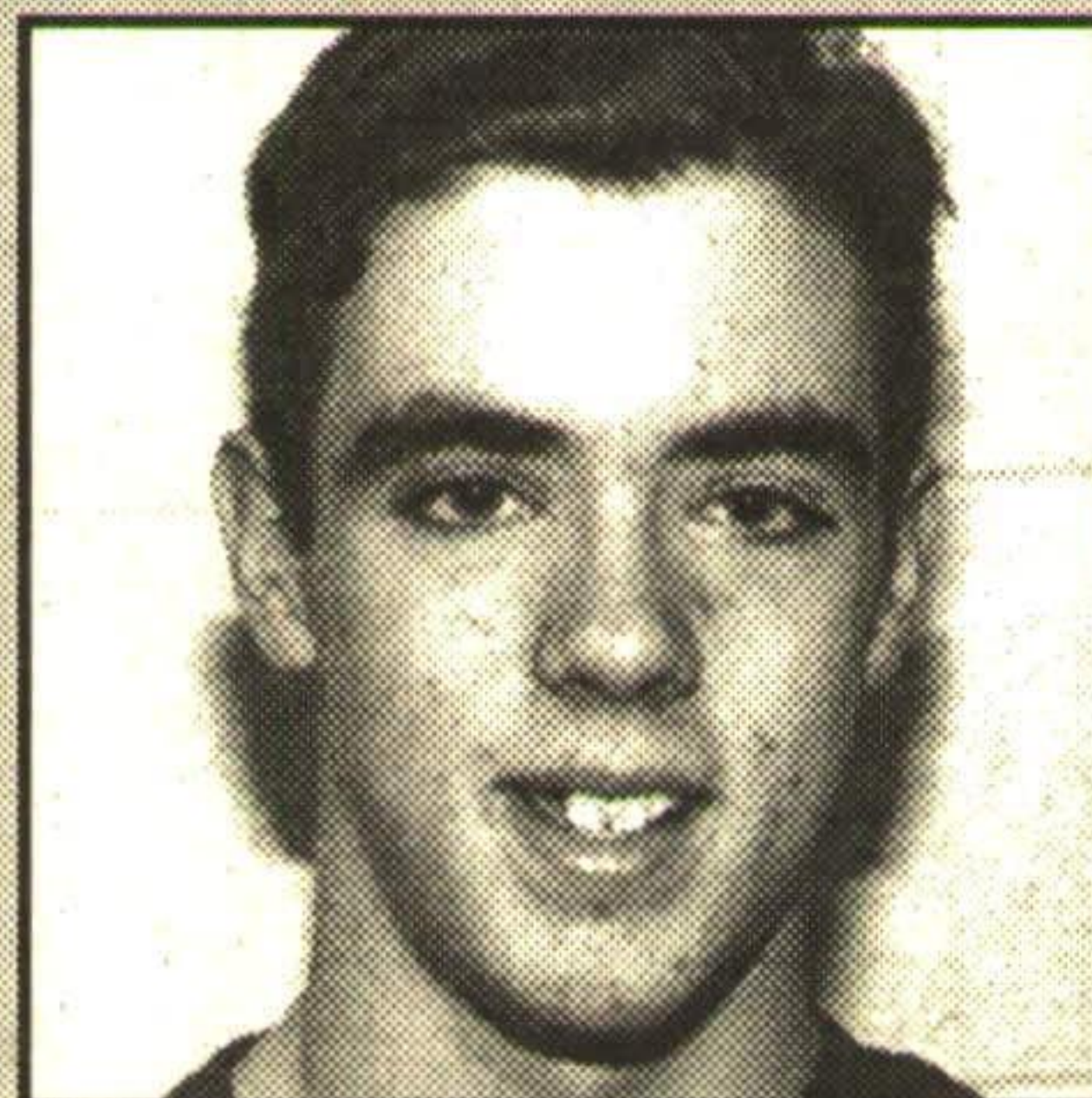
