## Minor atoms collapse in third to miss sweep

It wasn't planned but the M&M Pro Sports Minor Atom Raiders will have a chance to Lwrap up the Ontario Minor Hockey

Association championship at home.

Holding a 2-0 advantage in the best-of-five final, the Raiders surrendered a 5-2 lead in third period of Saturday's game. Richmond Hill then capped the comeback by scoring in overtime for a 6-5 victory. While Raider coach Jack Moon would have rather finished off the series, the loss does set up the potential clinching game at Alcott Arena Thursday night at 7:30 p.m.

After goals by Mark Boycott and Brad Torres, the Raiders blew open a 2-2 game in the second period with three goals in a span of 2:49. Boycott started

> the spree, Nick McLaughlin then finished off a nice play with Kevin Field and James Mountford made it 5-2.

Richmond Hill climbed back with a pair of powerplay goals less than a minute apart early in the third to narrow the margin to one and

then scored the tying goal on a deflection off a Raider player with 8:47 to play. Richmond Hill got the winner 45 seconds into overtime.

"We dominated the first two periods and then we played like we had it in the bag," Moon said of the loss. "That's a wakeup call. We were too overconfident even going into the game. Richmond Hill is not going to lay down."

Georgetown took the 2-0 series lead Friday night

at home with a 4-2 victory.

The Raiders led 1-0 after two periods and extended that to 4-0 with three goals in less than three minutes in the third. Mark Boycott, his second of the game, and Matt Velten scored on a fiveminute power play. Kevin Field scored 23 seconds after Velten to make it 4-0. Richmond Hill did manage to cut the lead in half by scoring twice but the Raider lead was never in jeopardy.

"We were breaking out of our end and getting a lot of two-on-one breaks," Moon said. "They have size but we have speed."

McLaughlin and Field each had three assists in the two games while Aaron Kirk and Velten had two apiece. Picking up single assists were Travis Bland, Shaun Dennie, Torres, Mountford and Boycott

As for trying to clinch the title on Thursday, Moon said there is not much the team needs to change.

"The kids have worked hard all year. They weren't expected to be where they are," he said. "We just have to play our normal game, use our speed and stay out of the penalty box."
