Local garden centres spring into action





cton resident Steven Brunelle pleaded guilty in Milton court Friday to impaired driving causing death, and three counts

of impaired driving causing bodily harm in relation to a March 8, 1996 collision that claimed the life of a Rockwood man.

manner that was dangerous to the public and one count of operating a vehicle while having more than 80 mg of alcohol in 100 ml of blood were withdrawn.

Brunelle is to be back in Milton court at 9 a.m. Monday, August 25 for sentencing.
