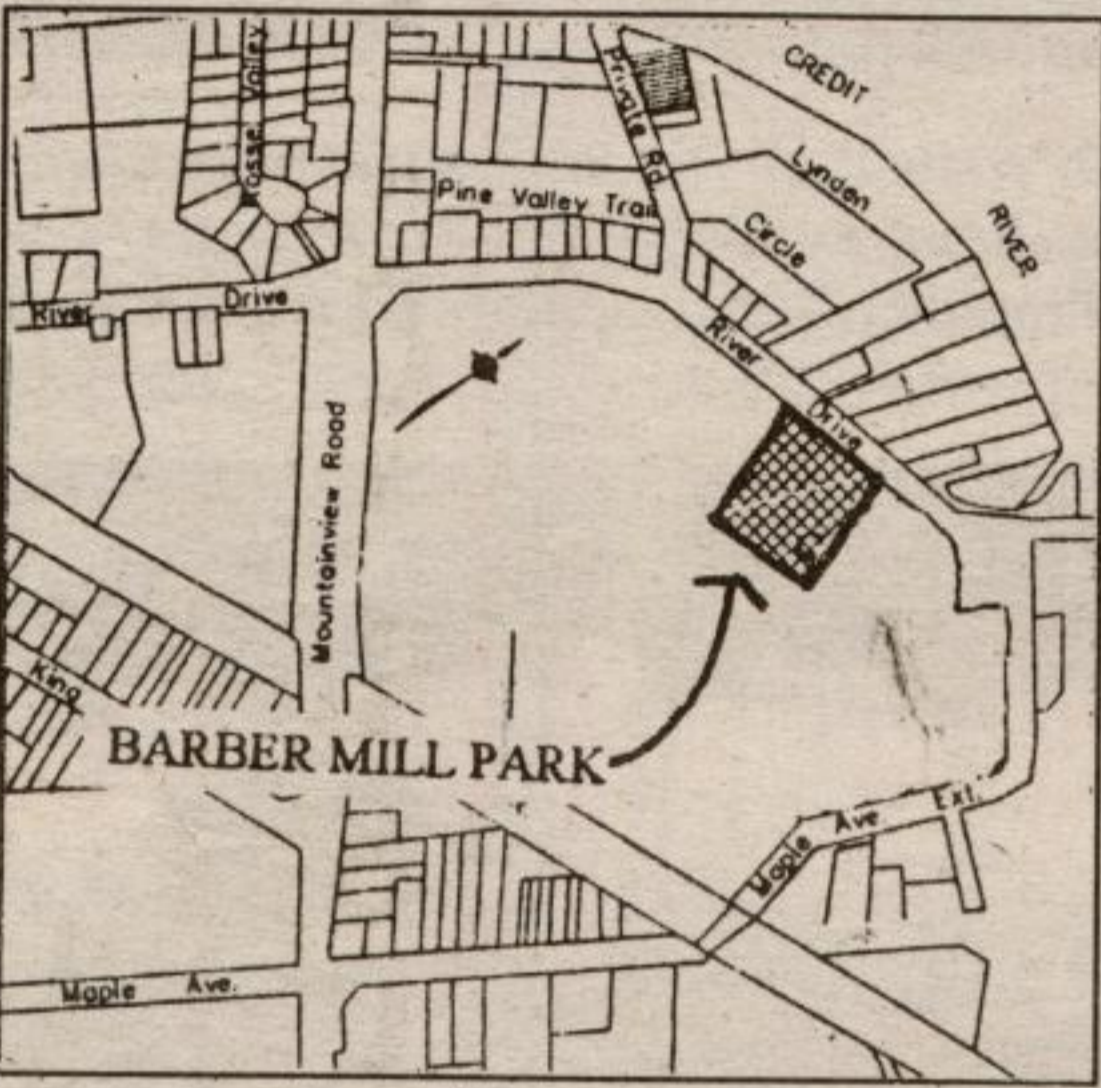

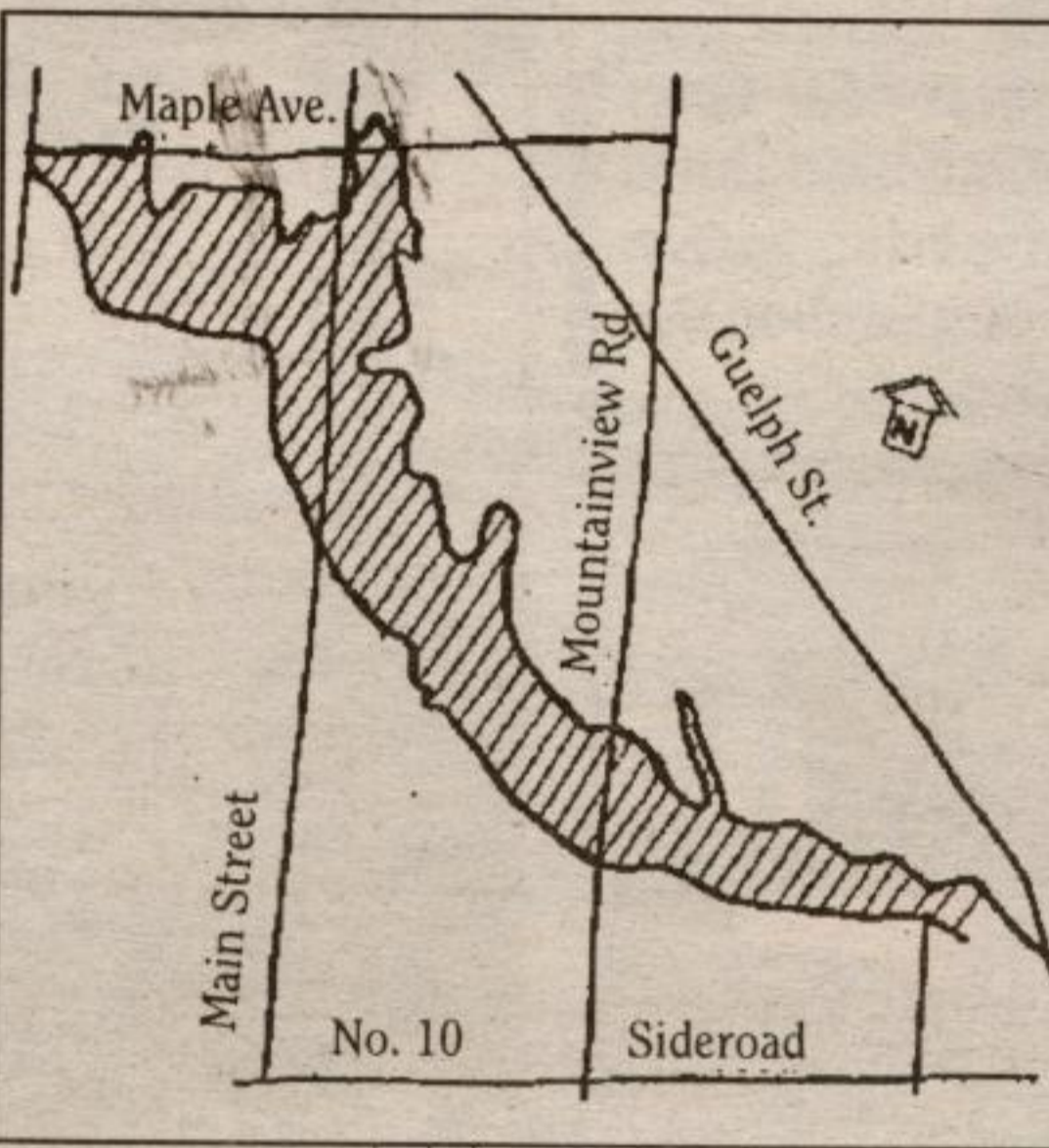
On Monday, November 10th, 1997, the Town of Halton Hills will be conducting a Municipal Election for the offices of:

Addition to be built this summer

Christian school expands

Thanks to generous donations from members and supporters of the Georgetown District Christian School a bright, new addition will be built at the school over the summer.

The \$280,000 addition, which will be nearly 4,000 sq. ft. will include a large new kindergarten classroom, a library and resource centre containing a computer lab, a new school entrance, staff room and offices.

School principal Trenea Sybersma said she is very excited about the school's new addition which was needed because of student population growth and changing education needs. The addition is to be completed by this September and at two fund-raising dinners members and supporters of the school pledged \$198,500 over the next three years to go toward the cost of building it.

Sybersma said the school's supporters and members are very committed and "every step of the way we were amazed."

The new addition will be situated at the front of the school and will jut out toward Trafalgar Rd. in two diamond shapes. There will be several windows in each room and Sybersma said the structure "will create some great spaces." No trees will have to be cut to accommodate the addition.

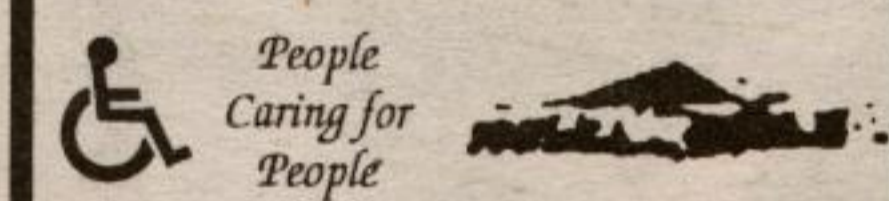
Due to the positioning of the diamonds an outdoor classroom will be created between the original building and new structure. Sybersma said it will be used for story time, science classes, art, and reading exercises.

The school was built in 1965 and at that time there 99 students attended the school. A gym and classroom were added to the school in the 1970s. Today there are more than 200 students enrolled at the school which serves Georgetown, Acton, Rockwood, Erin, Hornby and Milton. Growth in all classes is expected in the coming years. This fall the a preschool program was offered at the school which Sybersma said has been very successful.
